| 12 | § 2. DEFINITIONS |
| 13 | The following words as used in this title, unless a contrary meaning is |
| 14 | required by the context, shall have the following meaning: |
| 15 | * * * |
| 16 | (15) "Manufacturer's or rectifier's license": a license granted by the |
| 17 | Liquor Control Board that permits the holder to manufacture or rectify spirits |
| 18 | or fortified wines for export and sale to the Liquor Control Board, or malt |
| 19 | beverages and vinous beverages for export and sale to bottlers or wholesale |
| 20 | dealers. This license permits a manufacturer of vinous beverages or fortified |
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| 1 | wines to receive from another manufacturer licensed in or outside this State |
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| 2 | bulk shipments of vinous beverages to rectify with the licensee's own product, |
| 3 | provided that the vinous beverages or fortified wines produced by a Vermont |
| 4 | manufacturer may contain no more than 25 percent imported vinous beverage. |
| 5 | The Liquor Control Board may grant to a licensed manufacturer or rectifier of |
| 6 | spirits, fortified wines, vinous beverages, or malt beverages a first-class |
| 7 | restaurant or cabaret license or \underline{a} first- and \underline{a} third-class restaurant or cabaret |
| 8 | license permitting the licensee to sell alcoholic beverages to the public only at |
| 9 | the manufacturer's premises, which for the purposes of a manufacturer of malt |
| 10 | beverages, includes up to two licensed establishments that are located on the |
| 11 | contiguous real estate of the holder of the manufacturer's license at up to two |
| 12 | licensed establishments, which may be located at the manufacturer's or |
| 13 | rectifier's premises or at a location separate from the manufacturer's or |
| 14 | rectifier's premises, provided the manufacturer or rectifier owns or has direct |
| 15 | control over those the licensed establishments. A manufacturer of malt |
| 16 | beverages who also holds a first class restaurant or cabaret license may serve |
| 17 | to a customer malt beverage by the glass, not to exceed eight glasses at one |
| 18 | time and not to exceed four ounces in each glass. The Liquor Control Board |
| 19 | may grant to a licensed manufacturer or a rectifier of malt beverages a |
| 20 | second-class license permitting the licensee to sell alcoholic beverages to the |
| 21 | public anywhere on the manufacturer's or rectifier's premises. A licensed |

| 6 | not manufactured by the licensee and served at the event shall be purchased on |
