Resolutions

H.C.R. 316.

House concurrent resolution honoring Zachariah Fike and his Purple Hearts Reunited organization

Offered by: Representatives Strong of Albany, Branagan of Georgia, and Morrissey of Bennington

Whereas, Zachariah Fike of Georgia, Vermont, is a full-time member of the Vermont National Guard, having served in Iraq and Afghanistan, and his family's military service history dates to the Revolutionary War, and

Whereas, in 2009, his mother gave him someone else's Purple Heart medal as a Christmas gift, and although an avid collector of military memorabilia, he decided immediately to reunite the medal with its rightful owner, and

Whereas, although Zachariah Fike was deployed to Afghanistan a few days later, upon his return, now a Purple Heart recipient himself, and after much research, he returned the medal to the sister of the deceased World War II soldier to whom the Christmas gift Purple Heart originally belonged, and

Whereas, in 2012, as a result of this medal-returning experience, he established Purple Hearts Reunited (PHR), a nonprofit organization with a mission "to return lost or stolen military medals of valor to veterans or their families in order to honor their sacrifice to the nation," and

Whereas, medals are found in storage containers, pawn shops, and even trash receptacles, and

Whereas, PHR maintains an online database of missing medal owners, and

Whereas, some medals arrive unsolicited, and in other cases PHR has purchased the medal, and

Whereas, including purchasing, refurbishing, and framing the medal, as well as PHR's return ceremony, a typical return costs \$1,200.00, and

Whereas, the return ceremony is a dignified event at which a representative of the Military Order of the Purple Heart often offers historical remarks, and

Whereas, should it be impossible to return the medal to the wounded recipient or the soldier's family, PHR then arranges for permanent placement in a dignified home such as a museum, and

Whereas, Zachariah Fike has spent \$50,000.00 of his own funds for this cause, although PHR is conducting fundraising activities, and

Whereas, as of late-March 2016, PHR has returned 200 medals and is working on finding the home of over 300 others, an endeavor in which Zachariah Fike can take great pride, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly honors Zachariah Fike and his Purple Hearts Reunited organization, and be it further

Whereas, the VT Network is the statewide leader seeking the end of these unacceptable forms of personal behavior, and it works in partnership with other organizations, and

Whereas, it has been instrumental in the passage of both State and federal laws that benefit victims of domestic violence, sexual violence, dating violence, and stalking, and

Whereas, the VT Network strives for "a world free of oppression where actions, beliefs, and systems support all people to thrive," now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly honors and celebrates the 30th anniversary of the founding of the Vermont Network Against Domestic and Sexual Violence in recognition of the organization's exceptional commitment to community and individual safety in Vermont and advocacy work on behalf of these causes, and be it further <u>Resolved</u>: That the Secretary of State be directed to send a copy of this resolution to the Vermont Network Against Domestic and Sexual Violence.

Whereas, passenger rail service between Rutland and Burlington was halted in 1953, and in recent years, interest has existed in restoring this transportation service, and

Whereas, a prerequisite for Amtrak to extend the existing Ethan Allen train from its current terminus in Rutland north to Burlington is the installation of welded rail along the entire 67-mile distance, and

Whereas, the incremental progress towards implementing this infrastructure improvement has left only 11 miles of track updating to complete, and

Whereas, the projected cost to finish all required aspects of the project is \$26 million, including the construction of station platforms, and

Whereas, the Vermont Agency of Transportation applied for a \$12 million federal Transportation Infrastructure Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant to move the project towards conclusion, and

Whereas, in the fall of 2015, the U.S. Department of Transportation awarded Vermont a \$10 million TIGER grant, and

Whereas, although short of the requested sum, securing the \$10 million TIGER grant is a major step towards arranging for the balance of the needed monies, and

Whereas, the hope for completing the financing package includes utilizing \$3 million in federal highway funds to address road crossing problems and \$13 million in additional State funds, and

Whereas, although the inauguration of the extended Ethan Allen service is still several years in the future, State transportation officials and rail enthusiasts celebrated this important milestone in the restoration of intercity passenger rail service to Vermont's Queen City, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly congratulating the Vermont Agency of Transportation on receiving a \$10 million federal Transportation Infrastructure Generating Economic Recovery grant to help complete the western rail corridor from Rutland to Burlington, and be it further

Whereas, the highlight of the Lady Saints' 2015–2016 season was winning the United States Collegiate Athletic Association's (USCAA) Division II women's basketball championship game in Uniontown, Pennsylvania, where CSJ defeated Albany College of Pharmacy and Health Sciences 73–46 and executed a USCAA championship game record 20 steals, and

Whereas, the remarkable team included Shamari Brodhead, Chontayvia Kennedy, Arreonte Anderson, Regina Steele, Jazsala Laracuente, Nia Gilchrist, Elizabeth Turco, and Kelly Festa, and

Whereas, the Vermont Commission on National and Community Service (SerVermont) is the State's partner with CNCS, and

Whereas, in Vermont, there are currently a total of 25 CNCS projects, including those under the rubric of AmeriCorps (AmeriCorps National,

AmeriCorps State Competitive, AmeriCorps State Formula, and AmeriCorps VISTA); Senior Corps (Senior Corps, Foster Grandparent Program, RSVP, and Senior Companion Program); projects financed through the Social Innovation Fund; and miscellaneous programs, and

Whereas, there are 542 service locations statewide, including conservation and environmental organizations, counseling services, faith-based entities, food-support services, housing trusts, municipalities, museums, public libraries, recreation projects, senior and aging programs, and shelters for the homeless, and

Whereas, 2,242 Vermont service volunteers are working at these organizations, earning for their future use \$1,625,617.00 in educational scholarship funds, and

Whereas, in this fiscal year, CNCS is investing \$6,090,478.00 in Vermont; and local host organizations are supplying \$4,222,642.00; including \$334,372.00 of State funds, and

Whereas, for every federal dollar spent on national service, two dollars in other federal programs is saved, and four dollars' worth of benefits are sent to local communities, and

Whereas, today, April 5, 2016, service volunteers are visiting the State House, and their good works are highly commendable, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly designates April 5, 2016 as National Service Day in Vermont, and be it further

H.C.R. 321.

House concurrent resolution commemorating the bicentennial anniversary of the former Concord Corner Congregational Church building

Offered by: Representative Quimby of Concord

Whereas, on January 7, 1807, 17 individuals in the town of Concord organized a Congregational church, and

Whereas, on September 7, 1809, the congregation ordained the Rev. Samuel Goddard as its first pastor in an outdoor ceremony that attracted attendees from adjoining towns and featured the preaching of the Rev. Joseph Lee of Royalston, Massachusetts, and

Whereas, the pivotal event in the history of the Concord Corner Congregational Church occurred in 1816 when the congregation's magnificent new home was constructed, and

Whereas, the congregation selected a site on the hilltop that, at the time, served as the town's commercial and civic center and is now known as Concord Corner, and

Whereas, this impressive ecclesiastical edifice cost \$3,000.00 to build, a large amount for the second decade of the 19th century, and

Whereas, at the behest of one of the construction project's most generous donors, a Mrs. Azarius Williams, the new home of the Concord Corner Congregational Church was modeled on an existing church located in New York City, and

Whereas, a special element of this new center for worship was the installation of a "very excellent bell" described in a contemporary account as "the first in all the region," and

Whereas, on March 4, 1823, Mr. Samuel Hall, a licentiate of the Worcester County (Massachusetts) Association was ordained as the church's new pastor, and

Whereas, in accordance with his condition for accepting the Concord Corner pulpit, the Rev. Samuel Hall established a normal school or seminary that, according to the University of Vermont, was the first in the nation for training teachers, and

Whereas, during the Rev. Samuel Hall's tenure, which ended in 1830, the congregation prospered, adding 48 new members, and

Whereas, subsequent religious leadership included Mr. Solon Martin, the Rev. John Wooster, and the Rev. Josiah Morse, but as the commercial center of Concord shifted to the west, this glorious house of worship closed its doors and is no longer standing, now therefore be it

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:

That the General Assembly commemorates the bicentennial anniversary of the former Concord Corner Congregational Church building, and be it further

<u>Resolved</u>: That the Secretary of State be directed to send a copy of this resolution to the Concord Historical Society.

Whereas, President Obama has traveled extensively abroad, but the Cuban sojourn was Coolidge's sole presidential trip beyond our nation's borders, and

Whereas, each president traveled with his wife, and President Obama's daughters also accompanied him, and

Whereas, President Coolidge received an enthusiastic welcome, met with Cuban President Gerardo Machado y Morales, and delivered an address to the Pan-American Congress that was meeting in Havana, and

Whereas, President Obama was greeted with a red carpet ceremony, met with Cuban President Raúl Castro, and delivered a major policy speech in Havana's Grand Theater, where President Coolidge had spoken, and

Whereas, 2016 is an ideal year to recollect President Calvin Coolidge's historic 1928 journey to Cuba, now therefore be it

Whereas, the General Assembly has a history of supporting the State's family forests and woodland owners, and

Whereas, in 1978, Vermont Law School (VLS) established its Environmental Law Center (ELC), and over the past 26 years, the magazine *U.S. News & World Report* has ranked VLS as the home of the nation's top environmental law program on 18 occasions, including "for 2017," and

Whereas, in recent years, VLS has focused on the interaction of environmental and energy policy through the establishment of an Institute for Energy and the Environment (IEE) with a mission "to have fewer greenhouse gas emissions in 50 years because of the work we do today," and

Whereas, in 2014, IEE established the Energy Clinic, a full-year law clinic that is focused on solar development and especially models that advance community solar ownership, and

Whereas, through the recently completed construction of a 500-kilowatt solar photovoltaic project on Gee Hill Road in South Royalton ,VLS has taken the goal of eliminating greenhouse gas emissions to heart as part of the American College & University Presidents' Climate Commitment, and

Whereas, students in the Energy Clinic played a major role in the legal work leading to the construction of this renewable energy project that will supply over one-half of VLS's electric energy requirements and reduce the school's carbon footprint, and

Whereas, VLS evaluated seven proposals in a competitive solicitation process and entered into an agreement with a local solar company that built and will own and operate the project, and

Whereas, the school will purchase all of the project's net metering and renewable energy credits and will also retire the renewable energy credits to

guarantee that the solar energy generated will reduce both the school's and the State's carbon footprints, and

Whereas, the solar panels are elevated four feet above the ground to enable sheep to graze on the site, creating a unique and commendable combination of agricultural landscape preservation and renewable energy production, and

<u>Whereas</u>, representatives of VLS are visiting the State House today, April 6, 2016, now therefore be it
