# **Rep. Buxton of Tunbridge** explained her vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

The error that caused the need for the provision in question underscores the call for fidelity to our legislative review process. An accelerated path is not only ill-advised, it side-skirts the committee process and puts all our taxpayers in jeopardy."

## **Rep. Dame of Essex** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Last week the rules suddenly changed for every school board in the state and many who thought they were playing by the rules have been penalized. Last week we had an Education bill on the calendar, but it was pulled back because it was complicated. I voted yes to give schools clarity that on this one simple issue we will move forward with certainty and the unity that the Education committee gave us when it approved this exact language on an 11-0 vote."

# **Rep. Mrowicki of Putney** explained his vote as follows:

"Mr. Speaker:

Legislating on the floor, on the fly, does a disservice to the process and to the voters that sent me here. My vote supports thoughtful considerate deliberations and the hard work of your Education Committee, whether I agree with them or not."
