Bill Amended; Third Reading Ordered

H. 625

Rep. Krebs of South Hero, for the committee on Fish, Wildlife & Water Resources, to which had been referred House bill, entitled

An act relating to extending the exemption from encumbrance on title of properties subject to a pretransition stormwater permit

Reported in favor of its passage when amended as follows:

<u>First</u>: In Sec. 1, after "shall be repealed on June 30, $\frac{2016}{2018}$ " and before the period by striking out "<u>2017</u>" and inserting in lieu thereof "<u>2018</u>"

Second: In Sec. 2, 27 V.S.A. § 613, in subdivision (b)(2), after "June 30, 2016" and before ", the mortgagor" by striking out "2017" and inserting in lieu thereof "2018"

The bill, having appeared on the Calendar one day for notice, was taken up, read the second time, report of the committee on Fish, Wildlife & Water Resources agreed to and third reading ordered.
