

(a) Small farm definition. As used in this section, “small farm” means a parcel or parcels of land used for farming that:

(1) houses at least the following number of adult animals four equines; five cattle or American bison; fifteen swine; fifteen goats; fifteen sheep; fifteen fallow deer; fifteen red deer; fifty turkeys; fifty geese; one-hundred laying hens; two-hundred and fifty broilers, pheasant, Chukar partridge, or Coturnix quail; three camelids; four ratites (ostriches, rheas, and emus); thirty rabbits; one hundred ducks; or one-thousand pounds of cultured trout; or

(2)(A) is used for the preparation, tilling, fertilization, planting, protection, irrigation and harvesting of crops; and

Alternative #1

(B) which produced an annual gross income of \$10,000.00 or more from the sale of farm crops or farm products in one of the two, or three of the five, preceding calendar years.

Alternative #2

(B) used in connection with the sale of \$X,000.00 or more of agricultural products in a normal year.
