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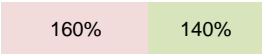

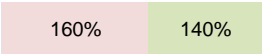

COMPROMISE (AT LEAST 0.2% HIGHER THAN STATE AVG)



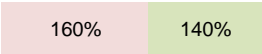
