Re: Concerns with S. 73 Data Breach Provisions

Dear Chairman Botzow:

On behalf of TechAmerica¹, I am writing to share our perspective on provisions of S. 73 (Draft No. 2.1, dated March 27). Specifically, we are concerned with the proposed language under Section 7 of the bill, which amends the Security Breach Notice Act by requiring electronic notices sent to consumers in the event of a breach to include in the notice a mechanism for the consumer to acknowledge receipt of the notice. We believe that this requirement is burdensome and unnecessary, and respectfully request that the Committee not move forward with Section 7 as drafted.

In its current form, the bill unfairly targets electronic notices most commonly utilized by the information and communications technology industry we represent. Under the bill, written and telephonic notices do not require a similar acknowledgement of receipt. If the intent of this language is to ensure that Vermont consumers receive notifications pursuant to the Security Breach Notice Act, imposing an additional requirement for businesses that provide electronic notices is ineffective and unnecessary as electronic notices are more likely to be viewed by a consumer. Email addresses are typically unchanged by a consumer whereas a mailing address and telephone number is changed when they move.

No other state with a breach notice law requires a mechanism for consumers to acknowledge a breach notice. If enacted, companies would be required to create a state-specific electronic notice that will further add to the costs of doing business in Vermont. This requirement is especially burdensome
