15	(a) For purposes of As used in this section, "agency" shall mean every
16	Executive agency and the Judicial Department, every department not within an
17	agency, every board, commission, or other entity not attached to an agency or
18	department for administrative purposes, every not-for-profit corporation or
19	entity occupying or using State-owned space, and shall include the Offices of
20	the Chief Justice of the Vermont Supreme Court, the Court Administrator's

1	Office, the Auditor of Accounts, the Attorney General, the Secretary of State,
2	and the State Treasurer. "Agency" shall not mean, nor shall this section apply
3	to, an entity not affiliated with the Executive or Judicial Branch of State
4	government and not located in State-owned property, even though the entity
5	may receive State capital funds. This section shall not apply to the Vermont
6	State Colleges.

8	(j) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Commissioner of
9	Buildings and General Services is authorized to lease State-owned property to
10	a private entity that is not an agency, provided that:
11	(1) the private entity is located within a municipality having the highest
12	unemployment rate in the State for the previous two calendar years; and
13	(2) the Commissioner determines that the lease would assist in
14	economic development in the municipality through increased workforce
15	development or tourism.
