7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to prohibit a
8	school district from paying tuition for a resident student to attend an
9	out-of-state public or independent school. The prohibition would not apply to
10	a district that pays tuition to a school located in another state or country for all
11	students in one or more grades, for its career technical education students, or
12	for a residential placement pursuant to a student's individualized education
13	program.

15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
16	Sec. 1. 16 V.S.A. § 822(a) is amended to read:
17	(a) Each school district shall maintain one or more approved high schools
18	in which high school education is provided for its resident students unless:
19	(1) the electorate authorizes the school board to close an existing high

school and to provide for the high school education of its students by paying

for the education of:

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1	tuition to a public high school, an approved independent high school, or an
2	independent school meeting school quality standards, to be selected by the
3	parents or guardians of the student, within or outside the State; or
4	(2) the school district is organized to provide only elementary education
5	for its students.

7	§ 828. TUITION TO APPROVED SCHOOLS; AGE; APPEAL
8	(a) A school district shall not pay the tuition of a student except to a public
9	school, an approved independent school, an independent school meeting school
10	quality standards, a tutorial program approved by the State Board, or an
11	approved education program, or an independent school in another state or
12	country approved under the laws of that state or country, nor shall located in
13	<u>Vermont. The</u> payment of tuition on behalf of a person <u>shall not</u> be denied on
14	account of age. Unless otherwise provided, a person who is aggrieved by a
15	decision of a school board relating to eligibility for tuition payments, the
16	amount of tuition payable, or the school he or she may attend, may appeal to
17	the State Board and its decision shall be final.
18	(b) Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a school district may pay
19	tuition to a public or independent school in another state or country approved
20	under the laws of that state or country if by doing so the district is providing

8	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
9	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2015, and shall apply to tuition paid by
10	school districts for the 2016–2017 academic year and after.
