3	referred House Bill No. 108 entitled "An act relating to electrical installations"
4	respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the
5	bill be amended by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu
6	thereof the following:
7	Sec. 1. 26 V.S.A. chapter 15 is amended to read:
8	CHAPTER 15: ELECTRICIANS AND ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS
9	SUBCHAPTER 1: GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	§ 881. DEFINITIONS
11	As used in this chapter, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:
12	(1) "Board" means the electricians' licensing board Electricians'
13	Licensing Board created under this chapter.
14	(2) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Public Safety.
15	(3) "Complex structure" shall have the same meaning as the term "public
16	building" as defined in 20 V.S.A. § 2900(8).
17	(4) "Electrical inspector" means a state State electrical inspector
18	employed pursuant to section 915 of this title.
19	(5) "Electrical installation" means wires, fixtures, or apparatus installed
20	in a complex structure or at the construction site of such structure for the

1	transmission and use of commercially supplied or privately generated electrical
2	energy.
3	(6) "Electrician's helper" means a person assisting in the construction,
4	installation, or repair of an electrical installation under the direct supervision of
5	a master or journeyman electrician who is present at the work site.
6	(7) "Legislative body" means the board of selectmen of a town, the board
7	of aldermen or city council of a city, or the board of trustees of an incorporated
8	village.
9	(8) "Municipal inspector" means an electrical inspector authorized to
10	conduct municipal inspections pursuant to section 898 of this title.
11	(9) "Registered apprentice" means an apprentice registered with the
12	apprenticeship division of the state department of labor Apprenticeship
13	Division for the State Department of Labor for electrical training.
14	(10) "Work notice" means the notice required to be filed under this
15	chapter by an electrician prior to commencement of electrical work.
16	§ 882. EXCEPTIONS
17	This chapter does not apply to:
18	(1) The construction, installation, operation, repair, or maintenance of
19	electrical installations which are used by a public utility in rendering its
20	authorized service; nor to the installation, operation, repair, and wiring
21	associated with telecommunication services and equipment used for the

1	transmission of information by electricity regardless of the location of such
2	electrical installations, equipment, or facilities.
3	(2) Electrical installations in ships, pipeline systems, railway rolling
4	stock, automotive equipment, or portable sound equipment.
5	(3) The manufacture, testing, or repair of electrical equipment in the
6	plant of the manufacturer of the equipment.
7	(4) The construction, repairs, or maintenance of buildings used
8	exclusively for agricultural purposes on owner-occupied farms.
9	SUBCHAPTER 2: REGULATION OF ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS
10	BY LICENSING BOARD

12	§ 893. COMMENCEMENT OF WORK; FEES; WORK NOTICE;
13	INSPECTION OF WORK; CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION
14	(a) Electrical work in a complex structure A person shall not commence
15	work on an electrical installation until he or she submits a work notice
16	accompanied by the required fee is submitted to the department Department
17	and the work notice is validated by the department Department validates the
18	work notice. There shall be a base fee of \$40.00 for each work notice, except
19	for electrical work done in one and two family residential dwellings. In
20	addition to the base fee, the Commissioner shall charge the following fees shall
21	be charged :

2	§ 894. ENERGIZING INSTALLATIONS; REENERGIZING AFTER
3	EMERGENCY DISCONNECTION
4	(a) A person shall not connect a new electrical installation in or on a
5	complex structure or an electrical installation used for the testing or
6	construction of a complex structure shall not be connected or caused to be
7	connected, to a source of electrical energy unless the Commissioner or an
8	electrical inspector issues a temporary or permanent energizing permit prior to
9	such the connection, either a temporary or a permanent energizing permit is
10	issued for that installation by the commissioner or an electrical inspector.
11	(b)(1) A person shall not connect an existing electrical installation that was
12	disconnected as the result of an emergency to a source of electrical energy until
13	a licensed journeyman electrician or licensed master electrician inspects the
14	electrical installation and determines the installation to be safe.
15	(2) This subsection does not apply to the use of a generator due to an
16	external loss of power.
17	(c) This section shall not be construed to limit or interfere with a
18	contractor's right to receive payment for electrical work for which a certificate
19	of completion has been granted.

21	§ 899. PRIVATE INSPECTIONS

21

1	(a) Upon a determination that the resources of the state and the municipality
2	are insufficient to provide the approval or inspection services required by this
3	chapter, the commissioner may assign responsibility for inspecting electrical
4	installations on its own premises to a private corporation, partnership, or sole
5	proprietorship person that has an ongoing need for services. Applications to
6	conduct private inspections under this section shall be in the manner prescribed
7	by the commissioner.
8	(b) The commissioner may grant an application under this section if he or
9	she determines that the applicant has the ability to carry out inspections. The
10	commission shall consider at least the following factors:
11	(1) the size of the facility;
12	(2) self-insurance or other indication of incentive and motivation for
13	safety;
14	(3) whether the applicant's training program for inspectors and inspection
15	procedures are at least equivalent to the state's program and procedures.
16	(c) A person authorized to perform private inspections under this section
17	shall:
18	(1) participate in state-sponsored training programs;
19	(2) file monthly reports with the commissioner containing the number
20	and type of inspections, electrical installations, violations for that month, and

the license numbers of the electrical contractors performing work;

1	(3) permit electrical inspectors to perform random inspections of the
2	applicant's facility;
3	(4) pay the department an annual flat fee. The amount of the fee shall be
4	negotiated by the department and the applicant and shall take into
5	consideration the cost to the applicant of conducting private inspections. The
6	fee shall not exceed the fee established under section 893 of this title.
7	(d) The commissioner may revoke an approval to conduct private
8	inspections whenever the commissioner determines that the training program is
9	insufficient or that the business has failed to comply with the provisions of
10	subdivisions (c)(1)-(3) of this section.
11	SUBCHAPTER 3: LICENSING ELECTRICIANS

13	§ 904. TYPE-S JOURNEYMAN ELECTRICIAN
14	(a) To be eligible for licensure as a type-S journeyman an applicant shall:
15	(1) complete an accredited training and experience program recognized
16	by the board <u>Board</u> ; or
17	(2) have had training and experience, within or without this state State,
18	acceptable to the board Board; and
19	(3) pass an examination to the satisfaction of the board Board in one or
20	more of the following fields:
21	(A) Automatic automatic gas or oil heating;

1	(B) Outdoor outdoor advertising;
2	(C) Refrigeration refrigeration or air conditioning;
3	(D) Appliance appliance and motor repairs;
4	(E) Well well pumps;
5	(F) Farm farm equipment;
6	(G) solar installations;
7	(H) Any miscellaneous specified an area of specialized competence
8	specified by the Commissioner.
9	(b) Upon successful completion of the examination and payment of the
10	required fee for each field in which a license is to be issued, the applicant shall
11	receive a license in the form of a wallet-size card which shall be carried at all
12	times while performing his or her trade and shall be displayed upon request.
13	Upon request of the licensee and upon payment of the required fee, the board
14	Board shall issue a license certificate suitable for framing.
15	* * *
16	§ 906. QUALIFIED OUT-OF-STATE LICENSEES; EXAMINATIONS NOT
17	REQUIRED
18	Licenses shall be issued without examination on payment of the required
19	fee. A The Commissioner shall issue a master's, or journeyman's, or type-S
20	journeyman's license, as the case may be, shall be issued without examination
21	on payment of the required fee to a person to whom a master electrician's

1	license, or a journeyman electrician's, or substantially equivalent type-S
2	journeyman's license has been previously issued by another state, whose
3	provided that:
4	(1) the issuing State has adopted standards that are equivalent to those of
5	this state State; and
6	(2) if under the laws or regulations of the state issuing the license a
7	similar privilege is granted to electricians licensed under the laws of this state
8	State.
9	§ 907. RECOGNITION OF EXPERIENCE IN OR OUT OF STATE
10	The board, in determining the qualifications of an applicant for a license,
11	may in its discretion give recognition;
12	(1) in the case of an application for a master's license, to the applicant's
13	experience as a licensed journeyman in another state, or;
14	(2) in the case of an application for a journeyman's license, to an
15	apprenticeship served in another state, or:
16	(3) in the case of an application for a type-S journeyman's license, to an
17	apprenticeship or to work experience in the relevant field in this State or in
18	another State; or
19	(4) may otherwise give recognition to experience or prior qualifications.
20	* * *
21	§ 910. LICENSE NOT REQUIRED

1	A license shall not be required for the following types of work:
2	(1) Any electrical work, including construction, installation, operation,
3	maintenance, and repair of electrical installations in, on or about equipment or
4	premises, which are owned or leased by the operator of any industrial or
5	manufacturing plant, if the work is done under the supervision of an electrical
6	engineer or master electrician in the employ of the operator;
7	(2) Installation in laboratories of exposed electrical wiring for
8	experimental purposes only;.
9	(3) Any electrical work by an owner or his or her regular employees in
10	the owner's freestanding single unit or two-unit residence, in outbuildings
11	accessory to such his or her freestanding single unit residence, or any structure
12	on an owner-occupied farms; farm.
13	(4) Electrical installations performed as a part of a training project of a
14	vocational school or other educational institution. However, the installation
15	shall be inspected if the building in which the installation is made, is to be used
16	or occupied following the training as a "complex structure";
17	(5) Electrical work performed by an electrician's helper under the direct
18	supervision of a person who holds an appropriate license issued under this
19	chapter <u>;</u>
20	(6) Any electrical work in a building used for dwelling or residential
21	purposes which contains no more than two dwelling units; [Repealed.]

1	(7) Installation of solar electric modules and racking on complex
2	structures to the point of connection to field-fabricated wiring and erection of
3	net metered wind turbines. [Repealed.]

5	Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE
6	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2015, except that the amendments to 26
7	V.S.A. § 910 in Sec. 1 of this act shall take effect on July 1, 2017.
