6	all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
7	Sec. 1. 7 V.S.A. § 101 is amended to read:
8	§ 101. COMPOSITION OF DEPARTMENT; COMMISSIONER OF
9	LIQUOR CONTROL; LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD
10	(a) The Department of Liquor Control, created by 3 V.S.A. § 212, shall
11	include the Commissioner of Liquor Control and the Liquor Control Board.
12	(b)(1) The Liquor Control Board shall consist of five persons, not more
13	than three members of which shall belong to the same political party.
14	(2)(A) Biennially, with With the advice and consent of the Senate, the
15	Governor shall appoint a person as a member members of such the Board for a
16	staggered five year term, whose staggered five-year terms.
17	(B) The Governor shall fill a vacancy occurring during a term by
18	appointment for the unexpired term in accordance with the provisions of
19	3 V.S.A. § 257(b).
20	(C) A member's term of office shall commence on February 1 of the
21	year in which such appointment is made the member is appointed.

1	(3) A member of the Board may serve for no more than two consecutive
2	<u>terms.</u>
3	(4) The Governor shall biennially designate a member of such the Board
4	to be its Chair.
5	Sec. 2. 7 V.S.A. § 106 is amended to read:
6	§ 106. COMMISSIONER OF LIQUOR CONTROL; REPORTS;
7	RECOMMENDATIONS
8	The board shall employ an executive officer, who shall be the secretary of
9	the board and shall be called the commissioner of liquor control. The
10	commissioner shall be appointed for an indefinite period and shall be subject to
11	removal upon the majority vote of the entire board. At such times and in such
12	detail as the board directs, the commissioner shall make reports to the board
13	concerning the liquor distribution system of the state, together with such
14	recommendations as he deems proper for the promotion of the general good of
15	the state.
16	(a)(1) With the advice and consent of the Senate, the Governor shall
17	appoint from among no fewer than three candidates proposed by the Liquor
18	Control Board a Commissioner of Liquor Control for a term of four years.
19	(2) The Board shall review the applicants for the position of

8	(b) The Commissioner shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor until the
9	end of the term for which he or she is appointed or until a successor is
10	appointed.
11	Sec. 3. 7 V.S.A. § 107 is amended to read:
12	§ 107. DUTIES OF COMMISSIONER OF LIQUOR CONTROL
13	The Commissioner of Liquor Control shall:
14	(1) In towns which that vote to permit the sale of spirits and fortified
15	wines, establish such number of local agencies therein as the Board shall
16	determine, enter into agreements for the rental of necessary and adequate
17	quarters, and employ suitable assistants for the operation thereof. However, it
18	shall not be obligatory upon the Liquor Control Board shall not be obligated to
19	establish an agency in every town which that votes to permit the sale of spirits
20	and fortified wines.

(2) Make regulations Recommend rules subject to the approval of and
adoption by the Board governing the hours during which such local agencies
shall be open for the sale of spirits and fortified wines and governing, the
qualifications, deportment, and salaries of the agencies' employees, and the
business, operational, financial, and revenue standards that must be met for the

- (3) Make regulations Recommend rules subject to the approval of and adoption by the Board governing:
- (A) the prices at which spirits shall be sold by local agencies, the method for their delivery, and the quantities of spirits that may be sold to any one person at any one time; and
- (B) the minimum prices at which fortified wines shall be sold by local agencies and second-class licensees that hold fortified wine permits, the method for their delivery, and the quantities of fortified wines that may be sold to any one person at any one time.
- (4) Supervise the quantities and qualities of spirits and fortified wines to be kept as stock in local agencies and make regulations recommend rules subject to the approval of and adoption by the Board regarding the filling of requisitions therefor on the Commissioner of Liquor Control.
- (5) Purchase through the Commissioner of Buildings and General Services spirits and fortified wines for and in behalf of the Liquor Control

1	Board, supervise the their storage thereof and the distribution to local agencies,
2	druggists and, licensees of the third class, third-class licensees, and holders of
3	fortified wine permits, and make regulations recommend rules subject to the
4	approval of and adoption by the Board regarding the sale and delivery from the
5	central storage plant.
6	(6) Check and audit the income and disbursements of all local agencies,
7	and the central storage plant.
8	(7) Report to the Board regarding the State's liquor control system and
9	make recommendations for the promotion of the general good of the State.
10	(8) Devise methods and plans for eradicating intemperance and
11	promoting the general good of the state State and make effective such methods
12	and plans as part of the administration of this title.
13	Sec. 4. RULEMAKING
14	On or before July 1, 2017, the Commissioner shall prepare and submit to
15	the Liquor Control Board for its approval and adoption his or her
16	recommendation for rules to govern the business, operational, financial, and
17	revenue standards for local agencies as necessary to implement this act.
18	Sec. 5. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL; DRAFT LEGISLATION
19	On or before January 15, 2017, the Legislative Council, in consultation with
20	the Commissioner of Liquor Control, the Liquor Control Board, and the Office
21	of the Attorney General, shall prepare and submit a draft bill to the House

1	Committee on General, Housing and Military Affairs and the Senate
2	Committee on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs that
3	makes statutory amendments of a technical nature to improve the clarity of
4	Title 7 through the reorganization of its provisions and the modernization of its
5	statutory language. The draft bill shall also identify all statutory sections of
6	Title 7 that the General Assembly must amend substantively in order to
7	remove out-of-date and obsolete provisions or to more accurately reflect the
8	current practices and programs of the Liquor Control Board and the
9	Department of Liquor Control.
10	Sec. 6. 7 V.S.A. § 102 is amended to read:
11	§ 102. REMOVAL
12	After Notwithstanding any provision of 3 V.S.A. § 2004 to the contrary,
13	after notice and hearing, the governor Governor may remove a member of the
14	liquor control board Liquor Control Board for incompetency, failure to
15	discharge his or her duties, malfeasance, immorality, or other cause inimical to
16	the general good of the state State. In case of such removal, the governor
17	Governor shall appoint a person to fill the unexpired term.
18	Sec. 7. COMMISSIONER OF LIQUOR CONTROL; CURRENT TERM;
19	APPOINTMENT OF SUCCESSOR
20	The Commissioner of Liquor Control in office on the effective date of this
21	act shall be deemed to have commenced a four-year term pursuant to 7 V.S.A.

1	§ 106(a)(1) on February 1, 2016. The Commissioner shall serve until the end
2	of the four-year term, or until a successor is appointed as provided pursuant to
3	7 V.S.A. § 106. Notwithstanding any provision of 3 V.S.A. § 2004 or
4	7 V.S.A. § 106(b) to the contrary, during this current term, the Governor may
5	remove the Commissioner for cause after notice and a hearing.
6	Sec. 8. EFFECTIVE DATE
7	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
