3	House propose to the Senate that the bill be amended as follows:
4	First: In Sec. A.4, 7 V.S.A. § 2, after subdivision (38), by inserting the
5	following:
6	(39) "Public library or museum permit": a permit granted by the Liquor
7	Control Board permitting a public library or museum to serve malt beverages
8	or vinous beverages, or both, by the glass to the public for a period of not more
9	than six hours during an event held for a charitable or educational purpose,
10	provided that the event is approved by the local licensing authority. A permit
11	holder may purchase malt beverages or vinous beverages directly from a
12	licensed retailer. A permit holder shall be subject to the provisions of this title
13	and the rules of the Board regarding the service of alcoholic beverages. A
14	request for a permit shall be submitted to the Department in a form required by
15	the Department at least five days prior to the event and shall be accompanied
16	by the permit fee required by subdivision 231(a)(24) of this title. As used in
17	this section, "public library" has the same meaning as in 22 V.S.A. § 101 and
18	"museum" has the same meaning as in 27 V.S.A. § 1151.
19	Second: In Sec. A.12, 7 V.S.A. § 231, after subdivision (a)(23), by
20	inserting the following:

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1	(24) For a public library or museum permit, \$20.00.
2	* * *
3	<u>Third</u> : In Sec. H.1, by striking out subdivision $(c)(1)$ and inserting in lieu
4	thereof a new subdivision (c)(1) to read as follows:
5	(c)(1) In Sec. A.4, in 7 V.S.A. § 2, subdivisions (27) (definition; "special
6	events permit"), (28) (definition; "fourth-class license"), and (39) (definition,
7	"public library or museum permit") shall take effect on July 1, 2015. The
8	remaining provisions of Sec. A.4 (alcoholic beverages; definitions) shall take
9	effect on January 1, 2016.
