2	§ 1028b. HARASSMENT OF A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR
3	CORRECTIONS OFFICER
4	(a) As used in this section:
5	(1) "Corrections officer" means an employee of the Department of
6	Corrections whose official duties or job classification includes the supervision
7	or monitoring of a person on parole or probation or serving any sentence of
8	incarceration whether inside or outside a correctional facility.
9	(2) "Law enforcement officer" means a member of the Department of
10	Public Safety who exercises law enforcement powers, a member of the State
11	police, a Capitol Police officer, a municipal police officer, a constable who
12	exercises law enforcement powers, a motor vehicle inspector, an employee of
13	the Department of Liquor Control who exercises law enforcement powers, an
14	investigator employed by the Secretary of State, the Department of Health,
15	Attorney General, or a State's Attorney, a fish and wildlife warden, a sheriff or
16	deputy sheriff who exercises law enforcement powers, and a railroad police
17	officer commissioned pursuant to 5 V.S.A. chapter 68, subchapter 8.
