7	(a)(1) Prior to exercising the authority granted under this section, a regional
8	planning commission shall:
9	(A) draft bylaws specifying the process for entering into, method of
10	withdrawal from, and method of terminating service agreements with member
11	municipalities; and
12	(B) hold one or more public hearings within the region to hear from
13	interested parties and citizens regarding the draft bylaws.
14	(2) At least 30 days prior to any hearing required under this subsection,
15	notice of the time and place and a copy of the draft bylaws, with a request for
16	comments, shall be delivered to the chair of the legislative body of each
17	member municipality within the region. The regional planning commission
18	shall make copies available to any individual or organization requesting
19	a copy.
20	(3) The regional planning commission may make revisions to the draft
21	bylaws at any time prior to adoption of the bylaws. If revisions are made to the

1	draft bylaws, the regional planning commission shall hold a final hearing and
2	shall deliver notice as required in subdivision (2) of this subsection.
3	(b)(1) The draft bylaws required under subsection (a) of this section may be
4	adopted by a vote of at least 67 percent of the commissioners of the regional
5	planning commission in accordance with the voting procedures of the regional
6	planning commission.
7	(2) The draft bylaws shall be considered duly adopted and shall take
8	effect 35 days after a vote required under this subsection, unless, within
9	35 days of the date of adoption, the regional planning commission receives
10	certification from the legislative bodies of a majority of the member
11	municipalities in the region vetoing the proposed bylaws. In such case, the
12	bylaws shall be deemed repealed.
13	(c) Upon adoption of the bylaws under subsection (b) of this section, a
14	regional planning commission may:
15	(1) promote cooperative arrangements and coordinate, implement, and
16	administer service agreements among its member municipalities, including
17	arrangements and action with respect to planning, community and economic
18	development, joint purchasing, intermunicipal services, infrastructure, and
19	related activities; and
20	(2) exercise any power, privilege, or authority, as defined within a
21	service agreement under subsection (d) of this section, capable of exercise by a

1	member municipality as necessary or desirable for dealing with problems of
2	local or regional concern.
3	(d)(1) In exercising the powers set forth in subsection (c) of this section, a
4	regional planning commission shall enter into a service agreement with one or
5	more member municipalities. A regional planning commission shall require a
6	vote of at least 67 percent of its commissioners to enter into negotiations for a
7	service agreement.
8	(2) Participation by a member municipality shall be voluntary and only
9	valid upon appropriate action by the legislative body of the member
10	municipality. To become effective, a service agreement shall be ratified by the
11	regional planning commission and the legislative bodies of the member
12	municipalities who are a party to the service agreement.
13	(3) A service agreement shall describe the services to be provided and
14	the amount of funds payable by each member municipality that is a party to the

6	(f)(1) Funds provided for regional planning under section 4341a or 4346 of
7	this chapter shall not be used to provide services under a service agreement
8	without prior written authorization from the State agency or other entity
9	providing the funds.
10	(2) A commission shall not use municipal funds or grants provided for
11	regional planning services under this chapter to cover the costs associated with
12	of providing services under any service agreement under this section.
