1	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to approve an
2	amendment to the charter of the City of Burlington that would allow a police
3	officer to confiscate temporarily a deadly or dangerous weapon from a person
4	whom the officer has probable cause to believe has committed domestic
5	assault.

8	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
9	Sec. 1. CHARTER AMENDMENT APPROVAL
10	The General Assembly approves the amendment to the charter of the
11	City of Burlington as set forth in this act. Proposals of amendment were
12	approved by the voters on March 4, 2014.

16	ARTICLE 99. GENERAL WEAPONS REQUIREMENTS
17	§ 511. POLICE CONFISCATION DURING INCIDENT
18	(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of 24 V.S.A. §§ 2291(8) and 2295, the
19	City of Burlington is authorized to regulate the possession and control of
20	firearms as set forth in this section.

1	(b) Whenever, within the City of Burlington, a police officer has probable
2	cause to believe that a person has been the victim of domestic assault in
3	violation of 13 V.S.A. chapter 19, subchapter 6, the officer may confiscate any
4	firearm, ammunition, or deadly or dangerous weapon, as defined in 13 V.S.A.
5	§ 4016, that is in the immediate possession or control of the person believed to
6	have committed the offense.
7	(c) The police shall return the property within five days after it was
8	confiscated unless:
9	(1) the property is being held as evidence in connection with a legal
10	proceeding; or
11	(2) the person declines to accept return of the property.
12	(d) A person who fails to turn over a weapon when requested to do so by a
13	police officer pursuant to subsection (b) of this section may be subject to the
14	following penalties:
15	(1) a criminal offense punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00
16	or imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both; or
17	(2) a civil ordinance violation punishable by a fine of not less than
18	\$200.00 and not more than \$500.00.
