11	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to provide the
12	same monetary benefit currently available to survivors of firefighters and
13	emergency personnel to survivors of law enforcement officers.

15	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:

1	§ 3171. DEFINITIONS
2	For purposes of As used in this chapter:
3	(1) "Board" means the emergency personnel survivors benefit review
4	board Emergency Personnel and Law Enforcement Officers Survivors Benefit
5	Review Board.

7	(3) "Emergency personnel" means:
8	(A) firefighters as defined in subdivision 3151(3) of this title;
9	(B) ambulance service, emergency medical <u>personnel</u> , first responder
10	service, and volunteer personnel as defined in 24 V.S.A. § 2651.
11	(4) "Line of duty" means:
12	(A) <u>With respect to emergency personnel:</u>
13	(i) answering or returning from service in answer to a call of the
14	department or service for a fire, or emergency or training drill, including going
15	to and returning from a fire or emergency or participating in a fire or
16	emergency training drill; or
17	(B)(ii) similar service in another town or district to which the
18	department or service has been called for firefighting or emergency purposes.

1	(B) With respect to law enforcement officers:
2	(i) service as a law enforcement officer in answer to a complaint
3	lodged with the department, including going to, returning from, and
4	investigating the complaint or disorder; or
5	(ii) service under orders from the department or in any emergency
6	for which the law enforcement officer serves as a law enforcement officer.

8	(7) "Survivor" means a spouse, child, or parent of emergency personnel
9	or a law enforcement officer.
10	(8) "Law enforcement officer" means a law enforcement officer who
11	has been certified by the Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council pursuant
12	to section 2358 of this title.
13	§ 3172. EMERGENCY PERSONNEL AND LAW ENFORCEMENT
14	OFFICERS SURVIVORS BENEFIT REVIEW BOARD
15	(a)(1) There is created the emergency personnel survivors benefit review
16	board Emergency Personnel and Law Enforcement Officers Survivors Benefit
17	Review Board which shall consist of the state treasurer State Treasurer or
18	designee, the attorney general Attorney General or designee, the executive
19	director Chief Fire Service Training Officer of the Vermont fire service
20	training council Fire Service Training Council or designee, the Executive
21	Director of the Vermont Criminal Justice Training Council or designee, and

1	one member of the public to represent the interests of emergency personnel
2	appointed by the governor Governor for a term of two years, and one member
3	of the public to represent the interests of law enforcement officers appointed
4	by the Governor for a term of two years.
5	(2) Survivors of emergency personnel, employed by or who volunteer
6	for the state of Vermont, a county or municipality of the state, or a nonprofit
7	entity which provides services in the state, the following individuals who die in
8	the line of duty or of an occupation-related illness may request the board Board
9	award a monetary benefit under section 3173 of this title-:
10	(A) emergency personnel, employed by or who volunteer for the
11	State of Vermont, a county or municipality of the State, or a nonprofit entity
12	that provides services in the State; or
13	(B) law enforcement officers.
14	(3) The board Board shall be responsible for determining whether to
15	award monetary benefits under section 3173 of this title. A decision to award
16	monetary benefits shall be made by unanimous vote of the board Board, and
17	shall be made within 60 days after the receipt of all information necessary to
18	enable the board Board to determine eligibility.
19	(4) The board Board may request any information necessary for the
20	exercise of its duties under this section. Nothing in this section shall prevent
21	the board Board from initiating the investigation or determination of a claim

1	before being requested by a survivor or employer of emergency personnel or a
2	law enforcement officer.
3	* * *
4	(c) If the board Board decides to award a monetary benefit, the benefit shall
5	be paid to the surviving spouse or, if the emergency personnel or law
6	enforcement officer had no spouse at the time of death, to the surviving child,
7	or equally among surviving children. If the deceased emergency personnel or
8	law enforcement officer is not survived by a spouse or child, the benefit shall
9	be paid to a surviving parent, or equally between surviving parents. If the
10	deceased emergency personnel or law enforcement officer is not survived by a
11	spouse, children, or parents, the board Board shall not award a monetary
12	benefit under this chapter.

14	§ 3173. MONETARY BENEFIT
15	(a) The survivors of emergency personnel or a law enforcement officer who
16	dies while in the line of duty or from an occupation-related illness may apply
17	for a payment of \$50,000.00 from the state State.
18	(b) The state treasurer State Treasurer shall disburse from the trust fund
19	Fund established in section 3175 of this title the monetary benefit described in
20	subsection (a) of this section, and shall adopt necessary procedures for the
21	disbursement of such funds.

2	§ 3175. EMERGENCY PERSONNEL AND LAW ENFORCEMENT
3	OFFICERS SURVIVORS BENEFIT SPECIAL FUND
4	(a) The Emergency Personnel and Law Enforcement Officers Survivors
5	Benefit Special Fund is established in the Office of the State Treasurer for the
6	purpose of the payment of claims distributed pursuant to this chapter. The
7	Fund shall comprise appropriations made by the General Assembly and
8	contributions or donations from any other source. All balances in the Fund at
9	the end of the fiscal year shall be carried forward. Interest earned shall remain
10	in the Fund.
