### <u>Uninsured</u>

  - Can we tell why kids are uninsured in families with greater than 400% FPL?

# <u>Underinsured</u>

  - Can we show this information by age &/or income?
- More kids are now uninsured for more than a year. What can we say re: why kids are uninsured for longer & why that has changed?
