6	Subject: Health; patient choice at end of life; unused medication; safe disposal
7	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to establish a
8	process by which a patient with a terminal condition who seeks medication to
9	be self-administered to hasten his or her own death would name a personal
10	representative to be responsible for safely disposing of any unused medication
11	remaining after the patient's death.
12	An act relating to safe disposal of certain unused medications
13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 18 V.S.A. § 5283(a) is amended to read:
15	(a) A physician shall not be subject to any civil or criminal liability or
16	professional disciplinary action if the physician prescribes to a patient with a
17	terminal condition medication to be self-administered for the purpose of
18	hastening the patient's death and the physician affirms by documenting in the

patient's medical record that all of the following occurred:

1	(12) The physician wrote the prescription no fewer than 48 hours after
2	the last to occur of the following events:
3	(A) the patient's written request for medication to hasten his or her
4	death;
5	(B) the patient's second oral request; or
6	(C) the physician's offering the patient an opportunity to rescind the
7	request.
8	(13) Prior to writing the prescription, the physician requested and
9	obtained from the patient the name and contact information of an expressly
10	identified representative of the patient who would be assuming responsibility
11	for the safe disposal of any unused medication prescribed pursuant to this
12	chapter, and the physician provided information to the representative regarding
13	safe disposal of the medication, as well as a form for the representative to
14	complete after the patient's death and a preaddressed, postage-paid envelope
15	for the representative to use to return the form to the Department of Health.
16	(14) The physician either:
17	(A) dispensed the medication directly, provided that at the time the
18	physician dispensed the medication, he or she was licensed to dispense
19	medication in Vermont, had a current Drug Enforcement Administration
20	certificate, and complied with any applicable administrative rules; or
21	(B) with the patient's written consent:

1	(i) contacted a pharmacist and informed the pharmacist of the
2	prescription; and
3	(ii) delivered the written prescription personally or by mail or
4	facsimile to the pharmacist, who dispensed the medication to the patient, the
5	physician, or an expressly identified agent of the patient.
6	(14)(15) The physician recorded and filed the following in the patient's
7	medical record:
8	* * *
9	(15)(16) After writing the prescription, the physician promptly filed a
10	report with the Department of Health documenting completion of all of the
11	requirements under this section, including the name and contact information of
12	the expressly identified representative of the patient who would be contacting
13	the Department after the patient's death to attest to the safe disposal of any
14	unused medication prescribed pursuant to this chapter.
15	Sec. 2. 18 V.S.A. § 5291 is amended to read:
16	§ 5291. SAFE DISPOSAL OF UNUSED MEDICATIONS
17	(a) The Department of Health shall adopt rules providing for the safe
18	disposal of unused medications prescribed under this chapter.
19	(b) The expressly identified representative of a patient who was prescribed
20	medication pursuant to this chapter shall assume responsibility for the safe
21	disposal of any unused medication remaining after the patient's death in

1	accordance with the rules adopted by the Department of Health. Within
2	10 calendar days following the death of the patient, the representative shall
3	mail to the Department of Health the safe disposal of medication form
4	provided to the patient or the representative by the prescribing physician. If
5	the patient self-administered the entire dose of the medication prescribed, the
6	representative shall indicate on the form that all of the medication was
7	consumed and no medication remains for disposal. If the patient died prior to
8	self-administering the medication or the patient did self-administer the
9	medication but did not consume the entire amount dispensed, the
10	representative shall describe the manner in which the unused medication or
11	unused portion of the medication was disposed of, and shall attest that the
12	unused medication was disposed of safely. If the Department of Health does
13	not receive the safe disposal of unused medication form within 15 days
14	following the patient's date of death, the Department shall contact the
15	representative to determine the status of any unused medication.
16	Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE
17	This act shall take effect on passage.
