- Family support services.


CDD provides technical assistance, professional development, and mentoring opportunities to Vermont's early childhood and afterschool professionals.

Creating a Continuum of High Quality Services



Child Care Licensing

Regulation and monitoring all types of child care (CC) programs, including registered and licensed family child care homes, early learning and development centers, afterschool programs, non recurring care programs, and public preschool programs.

- 600-700 licensed CC programs
- 800-850 registered Family CC homes
- 300 400 active Legally Exempt CC providers
- Consumer Complaint Line
- Provider clearances
- 3 Supervisors, 9 Licensing Field Specialists, 4 Licensing Technicians
- 1763 Visits by licensors in State Fiscal Year 2014
- Approximately 8000 calls annually to the licensing unit from child care programs and parents with questions or concerns about licensing
- 426 CC Licensing Complaints received and addressed

Child Care Financial Assistance Program (CC FAP)

Child care financial assistance (sometimes called *child care subsidy*) is a benefit that helps eligible families pay for child care services. Payments are made directly to child care providers for services provided.

- Approximately 8400 children (5000-6000 families)
- \$45.7 million annually (SFY14: state and federal funds)
- Community based eligibility determinations
- Over 10,000 calls to CDD about payments
- \$120,000 recouped from improper payments through payment integrity investigations (calendar years 2013 and 2014 combined)

CDD Strategic Outcomes



- Vermont children, prenatal to age 16, and their families, have access to high quality services that are developmentally beneficial for children and strengthen families. They experience excellent customer service based on a common vision and delivered through well aligned services and programs.
 - ✓20% Increase in number child care programs participating in STARS (1049 programs participating in STARS as of 12/31/2014)
 - √17% Increase in number of programs receiving a licensing site visit
 - ✓ RBA Outcome based grants and contracts

CDD Strategic Outcomes

- Vermont's early childhood and afterschool practitioners have access to the supports and resources necessary to deliver high quality services.
 - ✓ 1603 trainings across the state
 - ✓ Grants and bonuses for professional development activities
 - Mentoring and support programs
 - ✓ Trainings are evaluated using a common evaluation tool current collecting baseline data to determine areas of need.
