18	INVOLVING A NONLISTED CRIME	
19	The victim in a delinquency proceeding based on an act that is not a listed	
20	crime shall have the following rights:	

1	(1) To be notified by the Court of his or her rights as provided by law		
2	and his or her responsibilities regarding the confidential nature of juvenile		
3	proceedings.		
4	(2) To be notified promptly by the Court when conditions of release are		
5	initially ordered or modified by the Court and shall be notified promptly of the		
6	identity of the child when the conditions of release relate to the victim or a		
7	member of the victim's family or current household. Victims are entitled only		
8	to information contained in the conditions of release that pertain to the victim		
9	or a member of the victim's family or current household.		
10	(3) To file with the Court a written or recorded statement of the impact		
11	of the delinquent act on the victim and the need for restitution.		
12	(4) To be present at the disposition hearing for the sole purpose of		
13	presenting to the Court the impact of the delinquent act on the victim and the		
14	need for restitution if the Court finds the victim's presence at the disposition		
15	hearing is in the best interests of the child and the victim.		
16	(5) To have the Court take a victim's views into consideration in the		
17	Court's disposition order.		
18	(6) To be allowed not to be personally present at any portion of the		
19	disposition hearing except to present the impact statement unless authorized by		
20	the Court.		

1	(7) To be informed by the Court after an adjudication of delinquency			
2	has been made of the disposition of the case. Upon request of the victim, the			
3	Court may release to the victim the identity of the child if the Court finds that			
4	release of the child's identity to the victim is in the best interests of both the			
5	child and the victim. Disposition in the case shall include whether the child			
6	was placed on probation and information regarding conditions of probation			
7	relevant to the victim.
