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Purpose of Briefing

Provide an overview of the town highway grant programs available to municipalities under 19 V.S.A. § 306

- Town Highway Structures
- Class 2 Town Highway Roadway
- State Aid for Nonfederal Disasters (still referred to as Town Highway Emergency)
- State Aid for Federal Disasters (Federal Highway Emergency Relief)

Town Highway Structures

- State grants for preserving, maintaining, repairing, or replacing bridges, culverts (36-inch diameter and larger), and retaining walls on Class 1, 2, or 3 town highways.
- Maximum state grant is \$175,000 per project.
- Local share 20% of total cost or,
- Local share 10% of total cost if:
 - Adopted latest State-approved codes & standards
 - Completed a network inventory
 - Submitted annual codes & standards certification of compliance
- VTrans district personnel work closely with towns to assist in the application process and to select projects.

Town Highway Structures





Class 2 Town Highway Roadway Program

- State grants for <u>resurfacing</u>, <u>rehabilitation</u>, <u>or reconstruction of</u> <u>paved or unpaved Class 2 town highways</u>.
- Maximum state grant is \$175,000 per project.
- Local share 20% of total cost or,
- Local share 10% of total cost if:
 - Adopted latest State-approved codes & standards
 - Completed a network inventory
 - Submitted annual codes & standards certification of compliance
- VTrans district personnel work closely with towns to assist in the application process and to select projects.

Class 2 Town Highway Roadway Program





State Aid for Non-federal Disasters (also known as Town Highway Emergency)

- Annual appropriation for <u>emergency aid in repairing, building, or</u> rebuilding Class 1, 2, or 3 town highways and bridges damaged by <u>natural or man-made disasters</u>.
- Sec. of Transportation shall determine that disaster is of such magnitude that state aid is both <u>reasonable and necessary to</u> <u>preserve the public good</u>.
- Disaster shall not qualify for assistance from FEMA or from FHWA ER programs.
- Towns eligible for the greater of either:

90% of repair/replacement costs

or

The eligible repair/replacement costs, minus an amount equal to 10% of the overall total highway budget minus the town's winter maintenance budget.

State Aid for Non-federal Disasters (also known as Town Highway Emergency)



State Aid for Federal Disasters

- Grants for the <u>repair or reconstruction of town highways</u> <u>eligible for funding under the Federal Highway Administration's</u> <u>Emergency Relief program.</u>
- To be eligible, the town highway must be either:
 - > Functionally classified as a rural major collector or higher or
 - Functionally classified as an urban collector or higher, within a designated federal-aid urban area
- Emergency Work: 100% federal funds (if done within first 180 days). Any emergency work done after the 180-day mark will be at the permanent work funding split.
- Permanent Work: 81.08% federal, 8.92% State, 10% local
