6	(a) The Secretary of Administration shall consider options for redesigning
7	the employer assessment, including considering the following:
8	(1) which of the following classes of employees, if any, should trigger
9	the employer assessment:
10	(A) employees who have health coverage that is offered by their
11	employer;
12	(B) employees who have health coverage through a plan offered to
13	their spouse or other family member;
14	(C) employees who are on Medicaid; and
15	(D) employees who are enrolled in a health benefit plan offered
16	through the Vermont Health Benefit Exchange, either with or without financial
17	assistance;
18	(2) the number of full-time equivalent employees in each of the classes
19	described in subdivision (1) of this subsection, including:
20	(A) the total number of individuals; and
21	(B) the total number hours;

1	(3) the number of employees who work for employers that offer health
2	coverage to their employees;
3	(4) the number of employees who work for employers that do not offer
4	health coverage to their employees; and
5	(5) a uniform assessment amount that would be imposed on all Vermont
6	employers, regardless of whether they offer health coverage to their
7	employees; and
8	(6) using current rates, the revenue that would be raised by amending the
9	existing employer assessment to:
10	(A) apply only to Vermont employees; and
11	(B) exempt from the definition of an uncovered employee under
12	21 V.S.A. § 2002 an employee who works for an employer that does not offer
13	health coverage to some or all of its employees if the employee has other
14	health coverage that is not Medicaid or a non-employer health plan offered
15	through the Vermont Health Benefit Exchange.
16	(6) On or before January 15, 2017, the Secretary shall submit his or her
17	findings, options for the redesign of the employer assessment, and
18	recommendation regarding the future of the employer assessment to the House
19	Committees on Health Care and on Ways and Means and the Senate
20	Committees on Health and Welfare and on Finance.
