# **Vermont Community Development Program**

Community Development Block Grants (CDBG)

#### **Overview**

The Vermont Community Development Program (VCDP) administering funding from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Activities that support economic development and affordable housing continue to be VCDP's top priorities for funding. The VCDP assists communities on a competitive basis by providing financial and technical assistance to identify and address local needs in the areas of housing, economic development, public facilities, public services and handicapped accessibility modifications. The program is designed to predominantly benefit persons of low and moderate income. In addition, financial assistance is provided to communities with urgent needs, such as threats to health and safety and removal of slums and blighted properties. The CDBG allocation for the last program year was \$6,339,221 and was enhanced with \$300,000 of Program Income receipts from a share of municipal loan repayments associated with VCDP funded economic development projects.

## **Program Accomplishments**

During this past year, VCDP was able to fund a total of 25 projects and which leveraged over \$60 million dollars. The majority of funds were awarded to housing, accessibility modifications and planning projects. A breakdown of awards made this year, by project types follows. Program income from previous grants, other returned funds from prior years, and a small forward commitment of next year's allocation made it possible fund all of the projects below.

## Housing

The VCDP awarded grants to 10 municipalities for housing projects that totaled over \$6.9 million in CDBG funding and leveraged over \$59 million in local, private and other federal and state resources. This collaborative effort will create or preserve 501 units of affordable housing and makes a significant contribution in addressing the affordable housing crisis.

**Community Development Block Grants Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR)** 

### **CDBG-DR Overview**

The Agency of Commerce and Community Development (ACCD) received \$39,592,211 from the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in Community Development Block Grant- Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds with 80% of the funding directed to Washington, Windsor and Windham counties. These funds can help communities with the necessary expenses related to disaster relief, long-term recovery, restoration of infrastructure and housing, and economic revitalization in the most impacted and distressed areas receiving major disaster declarations. Municipalities and non-profit organizations can apply for funding through a competitive grant application process.

During the 2015 Program Year, \$5,620,038 of the CDBG-DR funds were allocated to communities and nonprofits to help address the unmet and long term recovery needs from Tropical Storm Irene and the other declared major disasters in Vermont in 2011 and 2012. \$1,337,292 of CDBG-DR funds were allocated for enhancements to six previously funded grants to ensure project completion. Also, \$5,540,200 was allocated to Red Clover Commons Limited Partnership, creating 55 units of affordable senior housing.

Program staff conducted technical assistance to many CDBG-DR grantees for their projects during this year. The following is a summary of competitive and state direct CDBG-DR grants awarded during the 2015 Program Year and enhancements to previously funded grants.
