

### Vermont Correctional System

#### Possible Sentences

#### Order by the Court

- Probation:** Individual supervised in the community by a DOC probation officer. A judicial hearing is held when an individual may have violated the conditions of probation or committed a new offense.
- Imprisonment:** Individual sentenced to minimum and maximum terms of imprisonment.
- Home Confinement Sentence:** Individual sentenced to a term of imprisonment but placed on home confinement furlough in a pre-approved residence and under DOC supervision.
- Suspended Sentence:** Individual sentenced to imprisonment but placed on probation. A violation of probation causes sentence to be imposed.
- Deferred Sentence:** Individual given probation with no conviction. Does not incur criminal record unless individual violates probations
- Split Sentence:** Individual sentenced to a term of imprisonment, followed by probation.
- Treatment Furlough Sentence:** Individual sentenced to imprisonment but placed by the court on furlough to receive community-based treatment.
- Work Crew:** Similar to furlough, but participation in work crew mandatory.

#### Post Sentencing Options

#### Controlled by DOC

- Reintegration Furlough:** Individual allowed to serve part of sentence in the community under DOC supervision.
- Treatment Furlough:** Individual allowed to serve part of sentence, with both DOC and court approval, for the purposes of community-based treatment and under DOC supervision.
- Home Confinement Furlough:** Individual allowed to serve part of sentence in home confinement with DOC approval and under DOC supervision.
- Temporary Furlough:** Individual allowed to temporarily serve sentence in the community under DOC supervision for the purpose of visiting a critically ill relative, attending a funeral, obtaining medical services, contacting prospective employers, or securing a future residence.
- Good Time Credit:** Allows reduction in term of imprisonment. Since 2006, Good Time Credit is no longer awarded but some current inmates have reduced sentences from credit awarded prior to 2006.
- Parole:** Individual released prior to serving maximum sentence. Approved through parole board.
- Conditional Re-entry:** Conditional Re-entry: Individual released to participate in a Re-entry program supervised by DOC.
- Prison Treatment Programs:** Free treatment offered by DOC and non-profits.
