I am here to support the bill that requires gender neutral bathrooms in state building because I am passionate about gender equality. If we are all being honest with each other, we can acknowledge that the luxuries the majority of people enjoy are not luxuries that everyone enjoys. It is no secret that transgender and non binary people face more violence and aggression than cisgender people do. Using the restroom is one of those luxuries.
