## **Current State of Water Grant and Loan Statutes; General Outline of the Two Chapters:**

## 10 V.S.A. Chp. 55 includes:

- Subchapter on municipal engineering planning advances
- Individual sections governing municipal loans and grants for each of the following types of projects:
  - Water supply
  - Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs)
  - Dry weather sewage flows
  - Wastewater treatment facilities with capacity of 250,000 gallons or more per day
- Section regarding priority system for awarding loans and grants to projects

## 24 V.S.A. Chp. 120 includes:

- Section listing all revolving loans funds
  - Clean Water State Revolving Fund
  - o Drinking Water State Revolving Fund
  - Vermont Pollution Control Revolving Fund
  - Several special funds dedicated to drinking water
  - o Vermont Wastewater and Potable Water Revolving Loan Fund
  - Vermont Solid Waste Revolving Fund
- Sections regarding the following:
  - Municipality may apply for loans for:
    - Publicly-owned sewage systems
    - Sewage treatment or disposal plants
    - Pollution control facilities
    - Water supply and water system projects
    - Solid waste handling
    - Privately-owned wastewater systems
  - Priority system requirements. Based upon priority system, Agency submits project priority list to the Bond Bank
  - o Municipal application to Bond Bank and loan agreement provisions
  - Bond Bank awards loans to eligible projects from appropriate revolving loan fund based upon priority list and loan applications
- Sections regarding loans for privately-owned wastewater systems and potable water supplies
- Subchapter on loans to private entities for public water systems
