5 First: In Sec. 2, amending 2015 Acts and Resolves No. 26, Sec. 3, in
6 subsection (a), by striking out “\$125,000.000” and inserting in lieu thereof
7 “\$125,000.00”, in subdivision (b)(2), by striking out “\$6,313,881.00” and
8 inserting in lieu thereof “\$5,813,881.00” and by striking out all after
9 subsection (c) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

14 striking out the section in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the
15 following:

19 (b) The ~~sum of \$1,400,000.00~~ following sums are appropriated in
20 FY 2017 to the University of Vermont for the following projects:

1 (g) The sum of \$2,230,000.00 is appropriated in FY 2017 to the
2 Department of Buildings and General Services for the Department of Fish and
3 Wildlife for the Roxbury fish hatchery reconstruction project.

4 (h) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Commissioner of
5 Environmental Conservation may transfer any funds appropriated in a capital
6 construction act to the Department of Environmental Conservation to support
7 the response to PFOA contamination. If a responsible party reimburses the
8 Department for the cost of any such response, the Department shall use those
9 funds to support the original capital appropriation and shall notify the House
10 Committee on Corrections and Institutions and the Senate Committee on
11 Institutions of the reimbursement.

16 striking out all after subdivision (c)(2) and inserting in lieu thereof the
17 following:

18 (3) Waterbury State Office Complex, blood analysis laboratory,
19 renovations: \$530,000.00

20 (d) The Commissioner of Buildings and General Services is authorized to
21 use up to \$50,000.00 of the amount appropriated in subdivision (c)(1) of this

1 section for acoustical enhancements at the Williston Public Safety Answer
2 Point Center (PSAP), if deemed necessary after consultation with the
3 Department of Public Safety.

4 (e) After the funds have been expended for Williston as described in
5 subdivision (c)(1) and subsection (d) of this section, the Commissioner is
6 authorized to use any funds remaining from the amount appropriated in
7 subdivision (c)(1) of this section to evaluate options to replace the Middlesex
8 State Police Barracks.

13 subdivision (b)(7), by striking out “of the amount appropriated to” and
14 inserting in lieu thereof “the balance of”, and by striking out subdivision (b)(8)
15 in its entirety

16 Sixth: In Sec. 17, amending 2015 Acts and Resolves No. 26, Sec. 21, by
17 striking subsection (d) in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

18 (d) The sum of \$200,000.00 from the balance of the Vermont Water Source
19 Protection Fund established in 24 V.S.A. § 4753 shall be reallocated to the
20 Vermont Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Drinking Water State
21 Revolving Fund in Sec. 11(d)(3) of this act.

1 Seventh: By striking out Sec. 30, State Correctional Facilities; Committee;
2 Assessment; Report, and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

3 Sec. 30. VERMONT STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES;
4 COMMITTEE; ASSESSMENT; REPORT

5 (a) Creation. There is created a Correctional Facility Planning Committee
6 to develop a 20-year capital plan for, and assess the population needs at,
7 Vermont State correctional facilities.

8 (b) Membership. The Committee shall be composed of the following:

9 (1) the Commissioner of Corrections or designee, who shall serve as
10 chair;

11 (2) the Commissioner of Finance and Management or designee;

12 (3) the Commissioner of Buildings and General Services or designee;

13 (4) the Commissioner for Children and Families or designee;

14 (5) the Commissioner of Mental Health or designee;

15 (6) the Commissioner of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living or
16 designee;

17 (7) the Executive Director of the Crime Research Group or
18 designee; and

19 (8) the President of the Vermont State Employees' Association or
20 designee.

1 (c) Powers and duties. The Committee shall assess the capital and
2 programming needs of State correctional facilities, which shall include the
3 following:

4 (1) An evaluation of the use, condition, and maintenance needs of each
5 State correctional facility, including whether any facility should be closed,
6 renovated, relocated, or repurposed. This evaluation shall include an update of
7 the most recent facilities assessment as of June 30, 2016:

8 (A) each facility's replacement value;

9 (B) each facility's deferred maintenance schedule; and

10 (C) the cost of each facility's five-, ten-, and 15-year scheduled
11 maintenance.

12 (2) An analysis of the historic population trends of State correctional
13 facilities, and anticipated future population trends, including age, gender, and
14 medical, mental health, and substance abuse conditions.

15 (3) An evaluation of whether the design and use of existing facilities
16 adequately serve the current population and anticipated future populations,
17 including whether the Out-of-State inmate program may be eliminated and the
18 feasibility of constructing new infrastructure more suitable for current and
19 future populations.

20 (4) An investigation into all available options for constructing new
21 facilities.

1 (5) An evaluation on potential site locations for a replacement State
2 correctional facility.

3 (d) Report and recommendations. On or before February 1, 2017, the
4 Committee shall submit a report based on the assessment described in
5 subsection (d) of this section, and any recommendations for legislative action,
6 to the House Committee on Corrections and Institutions and the Senate
7 Committee on Institutions.

8 Eighth: After Sec. 30, by adding a Sec. 30a to read as follows:

9 * * * Education * * *

10 Sec. 30a. VERMONT STATE COLLEGES; UNIVERSITY OF VERMONT;
11 CAPITAL BUDGET REQUESTS

12 On or before January 15, 2017, the Chancellor of the Vermont State
13 Colleges and the President of the University of Vermont shall each submit a
14 long-term strategic plan to the House Committee on Corrections and
15 Institutions and the Senate Committee on Institutions for the most effective use
16 of capital funds, including outlining priorities for whether to allocate future
17 capital appropriations to general construction, maintenance, and renovation
18 costs or to specific capital projects, and how to maximize the use of matching
19 grant funds.

20 Ninth: In Sec. 36, State House Security, by striking out subsection (a) in its
21 entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1 (a) The Sergeant at Arms is authorized to use funds appropriated in Sec. 15
2 of this act to:

3 (1) install a remote lockdown system for doors to the State House;

4 (2) conduct trainings at the State House; and

5 (3) install seven security cameras in the State House.

6 Tenth: In Sec. 36, State House Security, by striking out subsection (c) in its
7 entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

8 (c) On or before August 1, 2016, the Sergeant at Arms shall develop
9 lockdown guidelines and a camera use and data retention policy and procedure
10 for the State House. The lockdown guidelines and camera use and data
11 retention policy and procedure shall only become effective after majority
12 approval of the Senate President Pro Tempore or designee, the Speaker of the
13 House or designee, and the Chairs of the House Committee on Corrections and
14 Institutions and the Senate Committee on Institutions. No cameras shall be
15 installed until the camera use and data retention policy and procedure has been
16 approved.

17 Eleventh: After Sec. 36, by adding a Sec. 36a to read as follows:

18 * * * Repeal * * *

19 Sec. 36a. REPEAL

20 24 V.S.A. § 5609 (enhanced 911 compliance) is repealed on July 1, 2018.
