Representatives Clarkson of Woodstock and Komline of Dorset move that the House propose to the Senate that the bill be amended as follows:

First: In Sec. A.4, 7 V.S.A. § 2, after subdivision (28) by inserting the following:

* * *

(32) “Art gallery ~~or~~₁ bookstore, or retail store permit”: a permit granted by the Liquor Control Board permitting an art gallery ~~or~~₁ bookstore, or retail store to conduct an event at which malt ~~or~~ beverages, vinous beverages₁, or both are served by the glass to the public, provided that the event is approved by the local licensing authority. A permit holder may purchase malt beverages or vinous beverages directly from a licensed retailer. A permit holder shall be subject to the provisions of this title and the rules of the Board regarding the service of alcoholic beverages. A request for a permit shall be submitted to the Department in a form required by the Department at least five days prior to the event and shall be accompanied by the permit fee required by subdivision 231(a)(22) of this title. As used in this ~~section~~ subdivision, “art gallery” means a fixed establishment whose primary purpose is to exhibit or offer for sale works of art; ~~and~~ “bookstore” means a fixed establishment whose primary purpose is to offer books for sale; and “retail store” means a fixed establishment whose primary purpose is to offer apparel or jewelry for sale.

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(22) For an art gallery ~~or~~, bookstore, or retail store permit, \$20.00.

(23) For a fortified wine permit, \$100.00.

(24) For a community event permit, \$20.00.

Fourth: In Sec. H.1, by striking out subdivision (c)(1) and inserting in lieu thereof a new subdivision (c)(1) to read as follows:

(c)(1) In Sec. A.4, in 7 V.S.A. § 2, subdivisions (27) (definition; “special events permit”), (28) (definition; “fourth-class license”), (32) (definition, “art gallery, bookstore, or retail store permit”), and (39) (definition, “community event permit”) shall take effect on July 1, 2015. The remaining provisions of Sec. A.4 (alcoholic beverages; definitions) shall take effect on January 1, 2016.
