Eligibility

All Cathedral Square communities have eligibility requirements. Some are available to age 55 and older, some age 62 and older OR persons with a disability, some are for families who are furthering their education and others serve individuals with special needs.

Many of our communities offer project-based rental assistance, which calculates rental price based on income. Tax credit apartments, priced lower than market rate, are also available and Section 8 vouchers are accepted and welcomed.




