TO THE HONORABLE SENATE

The Committee on Health & Welfare to which was referred House Bill No. H. 11, entitled "An act relating to the membership of the Commission on Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders"

respectfully reports that it has considered the same and recommends that the Senate propose to the House to amend the bill in Sec. 1, 18 V.S.A. § 3085a, by striking out subsection (c) in its entirely and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

(c) Eight of the members appointed by the Governor shall serve terms of two years and eight of the members shall serve terms of three years. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed. Members first appointed to the Commission prior to January 1, 2015, may apply to serve no more than one additional term of either two or three years following the expiration of their current term. Members first appointed to the Commission after January 1, 2015, shall serve a maximum of two terms. A member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring other than by expiration of a term shall be appointed only for the unexpired portion of the term, and if the unexpired portion of the term is less than or equal to one year, the member appointed to fill the vacancy occurring other than by expiration of a term may thereafter apply to serve a maximum of two additional terms.

§ 3085b. COMMISSION ON ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND RELATED

DISORDERS

(a) The Commission on Alzheimer's Disease and Related Disorders is created.

(b) The Commission shall be composed of <u>17</u> <u>20</u> members: the Commissioner <u>Commissioners</u> of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living <u>and of Health</u> or a designee <u>designees</u>, one Senator chosen by the Committee on Committees of the Senate, one Representative chosen by the Speaker of the House, and <u>14</u> <u>16</u> members appointed by the Governor. The members appointed by the Governor shall represent the following groups <u>and</u> <u>organizations</u>: physicians, social workers, nursing home managers, the clergy, adult day center providers, the business community, registered nurses, residential care home operators, family care providers, the home health agency, the legal profession, mental health service providers, the area agencies on aging, <u>University of Vermont's Center on Aging, the Support and</u> Services at Home (SASH) program, and the Alzheimer's Association. The members appointed by the Governor shall represent, to the degree possible, the five regions of the State.

(c) Members appointed by the Governor shall be appointed for terms of three years and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. A member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring other than by expiration of a term shall be appointed only for the unexpired portion of the term.

(d) Legislative members shall be entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in 2 V.S.A. § 406 for no more than six meetings per year; the remaining members shall be entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in 32 V.S.A. § 1010 for no more than six meetings per year. Payment to legislative members shall be from the appropriation to the Legislature. Payment to the remaining members shall be from the appropriation to the Department of Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living.

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(h) Annually, on or before January 15, the Commission shall submit a written report to the House Committee on Human Services and to the Senate Committee on Health and Welfare with its findings and any recommendations for legislative action.
