1	TO THE HONORABLE SENATE:	
2	The Committee on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs to	
3	which was referred Senate Bill No. 241 entitled "An act relating to personal	
4	possession and cultivation of cannabis and the regulation of commercial	
5	cannabis establishments" respectfully reports that it has considered the same	
6	and recommends that the bill be amended as follows:	
7	First: In Sec. 9, 18 V.S.A. § 4230a(b), by striking out subdivision (6) in its	
8	entirety and by renumbering the remaining subdivisions in subsection (b) to be	
9	numerically correct.	
10	Second: In Sec 9, 18 V.S.A. § 4230a, after subsection (d) by inserting a	
11	subsection (e) to read as follows:	
12	(e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to do any of the following:	
13	(1) require an employer to permit or accommodate the use,	
14	consumption, possession, transfer, display, transportation, sale, or growing of	
15	cannabis in the workplace;	
16	(2) prevent an employer from adopting a policy that restricts the use of	
17	cannabis by employees;	
18	(3) prevent an employer from adopting a policy that prohibits the use of	
19	cannabis in the workplace;	

1	(4) create a cause of action against an employer that discharges an	
2	employee for violating a policy that restricts or prohibits the use of cannabis by	
3	employees; or	
4	(5) prevent an employer from prohibiting or otherwise regulating the	
5	use, consumption, possession, transfer, display, transportation, sale, or growing	
6	of cannabis on the employer's premises.	
7	Third: In Sec. 12, 18 V.S.A. § 4547, in subdivision (??) by striking out the	
8	word "and" and by striking out subdivision (??) in its entirety and inserting in	
9	lieu thereof the following:	
10	(??) study whether Vermont's workers' compensation and	
11	unemployment insurance systems are adversely impacted by marijuana use and	
12	identify regulatory or legislative measures to mitigate any adverse impacts;	
13	(??) examine the issue of marijuana in the workplace and determine	
14	whether Vermont's workplace drug testing laws should be amended to provide	
15	employers with broader authority to conduct drug testing, including by	
16	permitting drug testing based on a reasonable suspicion of drug use, or by	
17	authorizing employers to conduct post-accident, employer-wide, or	
18	post-rehabilitation follow-up testing of employees.	
19	(??) examine the impact of marijuana use on workplace safety and	
20	identify regulatory or legislative measures to address adverse impacts and	
21	enhance workplace safety; and	

1	(??) report any recommendations to the	he General Assembly or the
2	Governor, or both, as needed.
