Our country has a long history of philanthropy, and we believe charitable giving should be incentivized not discouraged.

Should you decide to cap charitable contribution, we strongly urge you to consider exempting contributions made to Vermont-based non-profit institutions as we believe this sector is critical to maintaining the social, economic, and educational health of our state. We support the Vermont non-profits that have already gone on record against the cap on charitable donations and join them in asking you to exclude charitable contributions from any cap on deductions.
