H. 872 – FEE BILL SECTION BY SECTION

As Passed the House

Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets
General Powers; Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets
Creates a new \$27.00 late fee for licenses, registrations, permits, and certifications renewed after the second renewal notice has been mailed.
Certificate of Free Sale
Reduces the Secretary's authority to issue only certificates of free sale for export of Vermont products, and not certificates of manufacturing. Reduces the Secretary's authority to issue certificates of free sale to only those who manufacture or produce Vermont food, not personal care products. Increases the fee per certificate.
Commercial Feeds
Increases the registration fee for commercial feeds, including livestock and pet foods.
Agricultural Lime
Increases the registration fee for agricultural lime products.
Fertilizer Tonnage Fees
Increases the annual tonnage fee on distributors of fertilizer from \$0.25 to \$0.50, and limits it to agricultural fertilizer. Imposes a \$150.00 base fee on both agricultural and nonagricultural fertilizer, rather than on nonagricultural fertilizer alone.
Maple Products
Increases the annual license fees for maple dealers and producers.
Seeds
Adjusts the certification fees for seed potato growers. Increases the inspection fees for seed manufacturers or processors who distribute seeds in the State.
Livestock Dealers
Increases the license application fees for persons who buy, sell, auction, or transport livestock.
Public Warehouses that Store Farm Products
Adjusts the annual license fee for public warehouses that store farm products.
Insecticides, Fungicides, and Rodenticides
Increases the annual fee per product for insecticides, fungicides, & rodenticides.
Pesticides
Increases licensing and certification fees for pesticide dealers, companies, and applicators. Eliminates exemption from certification and licensing requirements and fee for federal and state agencies and municipalities and public education institutions. Creates a new \$25.00 fee for private pesticide applicators.

Sec. 14-15	Milk Handlers' Licenses
	Creates a new annual cap of \$750.00 in fees for milk handlers' licenses for the transportation of bulk milk. Changes categories and corresponding license fees for milk handlers. Creates new milk handlers' license fee categories for amounts of milk handled per production day over 25,000 pounds.
Sec. 16-17	Dairy; Processing Equipment; Frozen Desserts
	Increases registration fees for commercial enterprises that sell, install, or repair milking, milk cooling and storage, or dairy processing equipment. Increases annual license fee for manufacturers of frozen desserts.
Sec. 18	Dairy Promotion Council
	Repeals fee on handlers for all fluid milk sold in Vermont. These funds have been used to promote the sale of milk and milk products.
Sec. 19	Retail Sale of Livestock and Poultry Products
	Increases fees for retail vendors with meat cutting operations or meat display space. Increases fee for all other meat-handling establishments except public warehouses that store meat and other farm products.
Sec. 20	Nursery Inspection
	Adjusts license fees for plant nursery growers or dealers.
Sec. 21	Plants Taken from the Wild; Ginseng
	Increases three-year fee for permit to collect and sell wild plants, including ginseng.
Sec. 22	Small Farm Certification
	Requires the Secretary of Agriculture, Food and Markets to report to the General Assembly in November 2016 with a proposed fee for small farms required to certify compliance with water quality requirements.
Sec. 23	Manure Applicators Certification
	Creates a new \$30.00 annual fee for the registration of custom manure applicators.
	Custom manure applicator means a person who engages in the business of applying manure or nutrients to land, and who charges or collects other consideration for the service.
Sec. 24	Laser Scanning Check-Out Systems
	Reduces the exemption for retail stores from the annual license fee imposed per retail laser scanner. The new exemption only applies to stores with two or fewer scanners. Stores with three or more scanners will be subject to the per scanner fee. Retains the current fee of \$10.00 per scanner.
Sec. 25-27	Weights and Measures
	Increases the license fee for public weighmasters. Increases the registration fee for weighing device dealers or repair persons. Increases the annual operating license fees for various meters and scales. Repeals the annual license fees for the following weighing devices: taxi meters, bulk plant meters, and all medium duty

	scales other than portable platform scales.	
Sec. 28-29	Welfare of Animals	
	Repeals the registration requirement for animal shelters or rescue organizations. Increases the license fee for pet shops.	
	Department of Financial Regulation	
Sec. 30-31	Business Entity Limited Lines Producers	
	Creates a new category of business entity limited lines insurance providers, so that a business may sell limited lines insurance such as travel accident or travel baggage insurance.	
	Creates a corresponding fee of \$150.00 for both the initial licensing and subsequent biennial renewals	
Sec. 33-34	Mutual Fund Fee; Investment Company Notice Filing	
	Increases the notice filing fee per portfolio or class of securities for investment companies, and divides it into two separate fees. Creates a new \$2,000.00 fee for the initial filing. Increases the existing \$600.00 fee required for each annual renewal to \$1,500.00.	
	Creates a new exemption for the Department of Financial Regulation to exempt it from limitations on what it raises revenues for through its fees. Allows DFR to raise revenues through its fees that are not directly related to its costs of regulation.	
	Center for Crime Victim Services	
Sec. 35	Marriage License Fee; Vermont Center for Crime Victim Services	
	Increases the marriage license fee collected by town clerks for issuing and recording a marriage or civil union license. The portion of the marriage license fee that is deposited into the Domestic and Special Violence Special Fund is increased by the full amount of the fee increase.

Sec. 36-37	Public Safety; Hazardous Substances; Fire Prevention	
	Increases fees for the use or storage of hazardous substances. Increases permit application fees for the approval of a construction plan according to fire prevention and building code.	
Department of Liquor Control		
Sec. 38-39	Liquor Control Licensing; Education Requirement	
	Increases many existing liquor licensing fees.	
	Establishes fees for required in-person or online training seminars for liquor licensees applying for new licenses or renewing existing licenses, or obtaining training for employees. Allows licensees to continue training their employees using materials approved by the Department.	
Sec. 40-42	Tobacco Licensing; Tobacco Substitutes; Education Requirement	
	Creates a new endorsement requirement and annual \$50.00 fee for anyone who sells tobacco substitutes, including electronic cigarettes.	
	Creates a new annual tobacco substitute manufacturer fee of \$1,000.00 per	

	brand, not including individual flavors.	
	Establishes fees for required in-person or online training seminars for tobacco licensees applying for new licenses or renewing existing licenses, or obtaining training for employees. Allows licensees to continue training their employees using materials approved by the Department.

	Inserts reference to new education requirement for common carriers of alcoholic beverages.

	Increases fees for resident combination hunting and fishing licenses, and for nonresident fishing licenses, and nonresident combination hunting and fishing licenses. Repeals fees for resident second muzzle loader licenses, second archery licenses, and for senior residents 65 and older to receive one or multiple licenses. Permits both resident and nonresident bear tags at any time during the season.	
	Creates new free senior licenses for residents 70 years of age or older.

	Creates new stormwater discharge permit fees for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFO): \$1,500.00 for a medium farm operation, and \$2,500.00 for a large farm operation.	
	Department of Labor	
Sec. 46	Workers' Compensation Fund Rate of Contribution	
	Maintains the Workers' Compensation Fund premium rate at 1.45 percent for fiscal year 2017.	
Agency of Education		
Sec. 47	Agency of Education; Educator Preparation Program Accreditation	
	Creates five new fees to fund the Results Oriented Program Approval (ROPA) process, which accredits Vermont institutions of higher education with educator preparation programs. The educator programs will pay the fees.

	(a) Sec. 5 (fertilizer tonnage fee) takes effect retroactively on January 1, 2016.(b) Sec. 48 (effective dates) takes effect on passage.(c) All other sections take effect on July 1, 2016.
