13	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
14	Sec. 1. 33 V.S.A. § 900 is amended to read:
15	§ 900. DEFINITIONS
16	Unless otherwise required by the context, the words and phrases in this
17	chapter shall be defined as follows As used in this chapter:

1	(7) "Home- and community-based services" means long-term services
2	and supports received in a home or community setting, other than a nursing
3	facility, and may include:
4	(A) services provided to individuals with traumatic brain injury
5	through a Medicaid waiver;
6	(B) services provided in residential care homes and assisted-living
7	residences;
8	(C) assisted community care services;
9	(D) attendant services;
10	(E) homemaker services;
11	(F) services funded through the Older Americans Act;
12	(G) adult day services;
13	(H) home health services;
14	(I) respite services for families including an individual with
15	Alzheimer's disease or other forms of dementia;
16	(J) services provided by the Home Access Project of the Vermont
17	Center for Independent Living:
18	(K) programs providing meals for young people with disabilities;
19	(L) services provided by the Sue Williams Freedom Fund of the
20	Vermont Center for Independent Living;

8	§ 904. RATE SETTING
9	(a) The Director shall establish by rule procedures for determining payment
10	rates for care of State-assisted persons to nursing homes and to such other
11	providers as the Secretary shall direct, as well as for inflationary rate increases
12	to providers of home- and community-based services. The Secretary shall
13	have the authority to establish rates that the Secretary deems sufficient to
14	ensure that the quality standards prescribed by section 7117 of this title are
15	maintained, subject to the provisions of section 906 of this title. Beginning in
16	State fiscal year 2003, the Medicaid budget for care of State-assisted persons in
17	nursing homes shall employ an annual inflation factor which is reasonable and
18	which adequately reflects economic conditions, in accordance with the
19	provisions of Section 5.8 of the regulations promulgated rules adopted by the
20	Division of Rate Setting ("Methods, Standards, and Principles for Establishing
21	Medicaid Payment Rates for Long-Term Care Facilities").

1	(b) No payment shall be made to any nursing home, on account of any
2	State-assisted person, unless the nursing home is certified to participate in the
3	State/federal medical assistance program and has in effect a provider
4	agreement.

6	§ 911. INFLATION FACTOR FOR HOME- AND COMMUNITY-BASED
7	<u>SERVICES</u>
8	The rates for providers of home- and community-based services authorized
9	by the Department of Vermont Health Access or the Department of
10	Disabilities, Aging, and Independent Living, or both, to provide home-based,
11	community-based, or home- and community-based services to individuals on
12	Medicaid or a Medicaid waiver program shall be increased by an annual
13	inflation factor commensurate with the average statewide inflation factor
14	applicable to all nursing homes pursuant to this chapter. The Division shall
15	calculate the aggregate inflation factor applicable to nursing homes annually
16	according to the procedure adopted by rule and shall report it to the
17	Departments for application to home- and community-based provider rates
18	beginning on July 1.
19	Sec. 4. EFFECTIVE DATE
20	This act shall take effect on passage and shall apply to home- and
21	community-based service provider rates on and after July 1, 2017.
