

## Landscape of Child Care in the U.S.

 Nearly <u>15 million children</u> of working parents are in some type of child care

On average, they spend <u>36 hours a week</u> in care


At least 1 in 4 families "piece together" their children's care as they

are placed in multiple arrangements


Almost <u>60 percent</u> of the cost of care is assumed by parents; spending <u>more than</u> <u>30%</u> of their monthly budget on child care – more than rent, utilities, transportation and food.

## Landscape of Child Care in the U.S.

- 2.2 million individuals earn a living caring for children under age 5
- They earn an average of \$21,310 one of the lowest paying professional fields
- Across the states, about 78% of slots are family child care, 20% are centers

Quality child care influences success later in life- a place for the four core areas of development related to readiness:

- Self-confidence
- Self-control
- Language and Literacy
- Thinking Skills



# **Why Quality Child Care Matters**

**Heckman Equation: ROI** 

\$1 invested many more \$\$\$ later

At risk children are

- 50% more likely to be placed in special education
- 60% more likely to never attend college
- 70% more likely to be arrested for a violent crime

## The Child Care System

#### **State-Level Child Care Systems:**

- Each of 50 states, District of Columbia, and DOD has unique system for state
- States can use funding from a variety of sources to blend with CCDBG funds, including TANF, RTT and Head Start
- Some states have Offices of Early Learning, while others use existing agencies to administer funds to families and providers.

#### The Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG) Program


- -Reauthorized in November, 2014
  - Approximately 1.8 million children receive CCDBG-funded child care in an average month
  - Primary federal grant program that provides child care assistance for families and funds child care quality initiatives.
  - Signed into law in 1990, t reauthorized in 1996 as part of welfare reform.
  - Now have to meet basic health, safety and quality standards.

February, 2015- President Obama called for \$82 billion investment over the next 10 years for child care early learning in his budget

# Early Head Start-Child Care Partnerships

- \$500 million included as part of FY2014 and FY2015 Spending bill
- Funds are awarded competitively through the Early Head Start grant process.
- All agencies eligible to apply for Early Head Start funds could apply for Partnership competition grants, including tribes and territories, community organizations, non-profit or for profit organizations, and state and local governments.



## **Child Care Cost Crisis**

- In every state, child care fees for an infant and a 4-year-old in a center exceeded annual median rent.
- In 30 states and D.C., the cost for an infant in a center was higher than a year's tuition and fees at a four-year public college.
- In every region of the United States, the average family spends less on food than it does for care for an infant in a child care center.
- The cost for two children in a center is the highest single household expense in the Northeast, Midwest and South.



## 2014 CCAoA Report Findings:

#### **Child Care in America is Expensive**

Child care is expensive, regardless of geography or income.
 Nationwide, families experience child care costs exceeding even college tuition in some states.

#### **Paying for Child Care**


 Unlike all other areas of education investment, including higher education, families bear the majority of the burden for child care costs.

#### **Expanding Access to Quality Affordable Child Care**

• Finding solutions to expanding access to and funding high-quality child care services is a national concern for government, business leaders, and families alike.


## Child Care Costs More than ...


Child care is a major expense in family budgets, often exceeding the cost of:





## **Comparison of Household Expenditures**





- 16<sup>th</sup> highest for infant center based care with costs running 12.5% of the state median income for a two parent family.
- For four year old center care it's 2nd least affordable, with 12.5% percentage of family income.
