10	(B) each facility's deferred maintenance schedule; and
11	(C) the cost of each facility's five-, ten-, and 15-year scheduled
12	maintenance.
13	(2) An analysis of the historic population trends of State correctional
14	facilities, and anticipated future population trends, including age, gender, and
15	medical, mental health, and substance abuse conditions.
16	(3) An evaluation of whether the design and use of existing facilities
17	adequately serve the current population and anticipated future populations,
18	including whether the Out-of-State inmate program may be eliminated and the
