

1       Sec. X. STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES; COMMITTEE;  
2                   ASSESSMENT; REPORT

3           (a) Creation. There is created a Correctional Facility Planning Committee  
4           to assess and develop a twenty year plan for the capital and programming  
5           needs of State correctional facilities.

6           (b) Membership. The Committee shall be composed of the following:

7                   (1) the Commissioner of Corrections, or designee;

8                   (2) the Commissioner of Finance and Management, or designee;

9                   (3) the Commissioner of Buildings and General Services, or designee;

10                  (4) the Commissioner of the Department of Children and Family  
11                  Services or designee;

12                   (5) the Commissioner of Mental Health, or designee;

13                   (6) the Commissioner of the Department of Disabilities, Aging and  
14                  Independent Living, or designee; and

15                   (7) the Executive Director of the Crime Research Group, or designee;

16           (c) Powers and Duties. The Committee shall assess the capital and  
17           programming needs of State correctional facilities, which shall include the  
18           following:

19                   (1) an evaluation of the use, condition, and maintenance needs of each  
20           State correctional facility, including whether any facility should be closed  
21           renovated, relocated, or repurposed. This evaluation shall include the  
22           following information as of June 30, 2016:

23                   (A) each facility's replacement value;

1           (B) each facility’s deferred maintenance schedule; and

2           (C) the cost of each facility’s five, ten, and fifteen year scheduled  
3           maintenance.

4           (2) an analysis of the historic population trends of State correctional  
5           facilities, and anticipated future population trends, including age, gender, and  
6           medical, mental health, and substance abuse conditions;

7           (3) an evaluation of whether the design and use of existing facilities  
8           adequately serve the current population and anticipated future populations,  
9           including whether the Out-of-State inmate program may be eliminated and the  
10          feasibility of constructing new infrastructure more suitable for current and  
11          future populations;

12          (4) an investigation into the options for cost-savings, including public-  
13          private partnerships; and

14          (5) an evaluation on potential site locations for a replacement State  
15          correctional facility.

16          (d) Report and Recommendations. On or before February 1, 2017, the  
17          Committee shall submit a report based on the assessment described in  
18          subsection (c) of this section, and any recommendations for legislative action,  
19          to the House Committee on Corrections and Institutions and the Senate  
20          Committee on Institutions.
