

FIVE STATES have expanded their DNA Database to include broad categories of convicted misdemeanants







NEW YORK was the first state to require DNA for misdemeanor convictions in 2006

## NEW YORK STATISTICS

**1,786** petty larceny convictions matched to:

78 homicides343 sexual assaults235 robberies764 burglaries

Because Criminals Do Not Specialize...

**89** % of New York's 3,547 offenders linked to a sexual assault were in the Database for a **non-sex crime**, such as petty larceny or trespassing

Because 90% of State Prisoners

Are Repeat Offenders\*...

**26%** of convictions for unauthorized use of a vehicle...

21% of convictions for theft of services...

Are arrested for a **violent felony offense** within 5 years of misdemeanor conviction

Because 70% of America's Crime is Committed by 6% of Its Criminals\*...

NY offenders linked to unsolved crimes averaged **3 prior non-qualifying convictions** before they being convicted of an offense that required a DNA sample
