16	(2) Effective on October 17, 2014, the Board adopted a procedure to
17	implement Criterion 9L (the Criterion 9L Procedure).
18	(b) The General Assembly determines that additional opportunity for
19	public comment on the Criterion 9L Procedure, as well as additional education
20	and improved guidance, would be beneficial in implementing the criterion.

1	(1) The Board shall revise the Criterion 9L Procedure in full
2	collaboration with ACCD and ANR.
3	(A) Prior to completing this revision, the Board shall solicit input
4	from affected parties and the public, including planners, developers,
5	municipalities, environmental advocacy organizations, regional planning
6	commissions, regional development corporations, and business advocacy
7	organizations such as State and regional chambers of commerce.
8	(B) The Board shall adopt the revision in the form of a procedure
9	under 3 V.S.A. chapter 25.
10	(2) Following the Board's revision of the Criterion 9L Procedure,
11	ACCD shall work with the NRB and ANR to develop outreach material,
12	including illustrative examples of appropriate development design, and
13	implement a training plan on Criterion 9L for local elected officials, municipal
14	boards, State and regional organizations and associations, environmental
15	groups, consultants, and developers.

18	(e) Vermont neighborhood Neighborhood development area.
19	Notwithstanding subsection (a) of this section, a determination by an
20	appropriate municipal panel shall not be subject to appeal if the determination
21	is that a proposed residential development within a designated downtown

1	development district, designated growth center, or designated Vermont
2	neighborhood, or designated neighborhood development area seeking
3	conditional use approval will not result in an undue adverse effect on the
4	character of the area affected, as provided in <u>under</u> subdivision 4414(3)(A)(ii)

7	(B) Primary agricultural soils. A permit will be granted for the
8	development or subdivision of primary agricultural soils only when it is
9	demonstrated by the applicant that, in addition to all other applicable criteria,
10	either, the subdivision or development will not result in any reduction in the
11	agricultural potential of the primary agricultural soils; or:
12	(i) the development or subdivision will not significantly interfere
13	with or jeopardize the continuation of agriculture or forestry on adjoining lands
14	or reduce their agricultural or forestry potential; and
15	(ii) except in the case of an application for a project located in a
16	designated growth center area listed in subdivision 6093(a)(1) of this title,
17	there are no lands other than primary agricultural soils owned or controlled by
18	the applicant which are reasonably suited to the purpose of the development or
19	subdivision; and
20	(iii) except in the case of an application for a project located in a
21	designated growth center area listed in subdivision 6093(a)(1) of this title, the

1	subdivision or development has been planned to minimize the reduction of
2	agricultural potential of the primary agricultural soils through innovative land
3	use design resulting in compact development patterns, so that the remaining
4	primary agricultural soils on the project tract are capable of supporting or
5	contributing to an economic or commercial agricultural operation; and
6	(iv) suitable mitigation will be provided for any reduction in the
7	agricultural potential of the primary agricultural soils caused by the
8	development or subdivision, in accordance with section 6093 of this title and
9	rules adopted by the Natural Resources Board.

12	If a holder of a conservation easement is or becomes the owner in fee
