Re: Survey Data for Businesses with Fewer than 10 Employees

Main Street Alliance of Vermont conducted a statewide survey of 759 main street business owners in Vermont between September of 2014 and December of 2015. One of the survey questions queried whether the businesses “currently provide any form of paid time off” to their employees. The Senate Committee on Economic Development, Housing and General Affairs requested disaggregated data from Main Street Alliance of Vermont’s survey that looks exclusively at the paid time benefits of businesses that employ fewer than ten employees.

Of the 759 total businesses included in the survey project, 401 employ fewer than 10 employees. Of those 401 businesses, 29% provide some form of paid time off to their employees. The question did not specify whether the paid time benefit was provided to all or some of their employees. Of these 401 businesses 63% responded that they do not offer a paid time benefit of any kind to their employees and 8% did not provide an answer to the question.
