<sup>1.</sup> Assumes stationary year-to-year revenues from parcel fees and Ag/DEC fees going forward. Parcel fee revenue will increase as the number of parcels increases. The trend over the past few years has been approximately 0.14% increase in parcels per year. Assumes that all parcel fees will be collected. Ag/DEC will probably grow to some extent based on overall economy but it is unclear whether revenues would be enough to offset increased staff/operational costs. Also assumes that appropriations for Ag/DEC would match revenues.

<sup>2.</sup> Assumes growth in property transfer tax revenues based on consensus revenue forecast and projected outward.

<sup>3. &</sup>lt;u>The Senate Agriculture block represents a proposal that does not currently exist in bill form</u> but does reflect the vision of the committee when it offered input on the bill before it was passed out of Senate Natural Resources. CWF project expenditures would be prorated in FY16 based on Administration's Year 1 estimated spending and appropriations for Ag/DEC staff would reflect the original request from the Administration.

<sup>4.</sup> Senator Finance proposal levies a minimum \$15 clean water fee on all parcels in Vermont plus an additional \$0.50 per acre on acreage above 15 acres on all woodland parcels enrolled in Current Use and \$1.00 per acre on acreage above 15 acres on all other properties. All Ag fees and DEC fees same as SNR.
