1	Whereas, although FairPoint promised to add hundreds of new jobs in the
2	three northern New England states, the company's post-2009 bankruptcy
3	workforce is now 20 percent smaller than in 2008, and
4	Whereas, in August 2014, FairPoint made what the company described as
5	its last offer to its unionized employees for a new contract, and
6	Whereas, the proposal would have resulted in reduced benefits, but the
7	unionized employees remained at work for two months and offered FairPoint
8	\$200 million in concessions, and
9	Whereas, after their best efforts and much frustration, in October 2014 the
10	employees' two unions, the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers
11	Local 2326 and Communications Workers of America Local 1400, authorized
12	a strike against FairPoint, and
13	Whereas, since the strike started, consumer complaints have risen
14	approximately 500 percent, resulting in much personal and commercial
15	inconvenience, and
16	Whereas, on November 28, 2014, the State's E-911 system missed 83 calls
17	in part due to FairPoint's operational problems, and
18	Whereas, at the request of the Department of Public Service, the Public
19	Service Board, on December 9, 2014, established Docket 8390 to investigate
20	the service problems FairPoint has encountered, and

1	Whereas, Governor Peter Shumlin, the congressional delegation, and the
2	leadership of the General Assembly's Working Vermonters Caucus have
3	written letters to FairPoint's CEO Paul Sunu calling on FairPoint to return in
4	good faith to the negotiating table, and the Caucus' letter indicated that failure
5	to reach a fair and timely settlement would result in General Assembly
6	members' examination of FairPoint's "financial strength and managerial
7	competence to properly serve the people of Vermont," and
8	Whereas, on January 4, 2015, in Washington, D.C., the Federal Mediation
9	and Conciliation Service convened a meeting between the parties at which the
10	Service assumed a more proactive role than in a prior session, now
11	therefore be it
12	Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives:
13	That the General Assembly expresses support for the Public Service
14	Board's establishment of a FairPoint Communications service investigation
15	docket and urges the management of FairPoint Communications to settle the
16	current employee strike in order to restore reliable telecommunications
17	services in Vermont, and be it further
18	Resolved: That the Secretary of State be directed to send a copy of this
