(1) A town clerk who intends to deposit ballots as described in
subsection (a) of this section shall post notice of this intention in at least two
public places in the municipality, in or near the town clerk's office, not less
than 30 nor more than 40 days before the election. If a municipality has more
than one polling place and the polling places are not all in the same building,
the notice shall be posted in at least two public places within each voting
district and in or near the town clerk's office.
(2) In addition, at least five days before the day preceding the election,
the notice shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the
municipality and on the municipality's website, if the municipality actively
updates its website on a regular basis.
(3) The notice shall include the time for depositing the ballots and the
