2	Senator Pollina moves that the Senate propose to the House that the bill be

4	First: After Sec. 4, 3 V.S.A. § 344, by inserting Secs. 4a and 4b to read as

6	Sec. 4a. WORKERS' COMPENSATION ADMINISTRATION AND
7	OFFICE OF RISK MANAGEMENT STUDY COMMITTEE;
8	REPORT
9	(a) Creation. There is created the Workers' Compensation Administration
10	and Office of Risk Management Study Committee to study whether the
11	workers' compensation adjustment and loss control functions of the Office of
12	Risk Management in the Agency of Administration should be contracted out to
13	a private entity and whether the Office of Risk Management should be given
14	authority to implement safety measures necessary to reduce the cost of
15	providing workers' compensation coverage to the State.
16	(b) Membership. The Committee shall be composed of the following five
17	members:
18	(1) one current member of the House of Representatives who shall be
19	appointed by the Speaker of the House;
20	(2) one current member of the Senate who shall be appointed by the
21	Committee on Committees;

1	(3) the Secretary of Administration or designee
2	(4) the Commissioner of Labor or designee; and
3	(5) the Executive Director of the Vermont State Employees' Association
4	or designee.
5	(c) Powers and duties. The Committee shall study whether the workers'
6	compensation adjustment and loss control functions of the Office of Risk
7	Management should be contracted out to a private entity and whether the
8	Office of Risk Management should be given authority to institute safety
9	measures necessary to reduce the cost of providing workers' compensation
10	coverage to the State, including the following questions:
11	(1) what are the actions, if any, that the Agency of Administration, the
12	Office of State Employee Workers' Compensation and Injury Prevention, and
13	the Office of Risk Management have taken in response to the findings and
14	recommendations of the Vermont State Auditor's 2013 Report on the State's
15	Workers' Compensation Program, and have those actions resulted in any
16	improvements in the performance of the Office of Risk Management or
17	reductions in the annual cost of satisfying State employees' workers'
18	compensation claims;
19	(2) whether providing the Office of Risk Management with the authority
20	to require State agencies and departments to implement safety measures would

1	reduce the annual cost of satisfying State employees' workers' compensation
2	<u>claims;</u>
3	(3) whether providing the Office of Risk Management with the authority
4	to require State agencies and departments to implement safety measures would
5	reduce the frequency of work-related injuries among State employees;
6	(4) what are the likely costs and benefits to the State of contracting out
7	the workers' compensation adjustment and loss control functions of the Office
8	of Risk Management to a private entity, including any projected changes in the
9	annual cost of satisfying State employees' workers' compensation claims, any
10	projected changes in the amount of work-related injuries among State
11	employees, and the projected annual cost of a private entity carrying out the
12	workers' compensation adjustment and loss control functions of the Office of
13	Risk Management; and
14	(5) how would the quality of the service provided to the State by a
15	private entity carrying out the workers' compensation adjustment and loss
16	control functions of the Office of Risk Management compare to the current
17	level of service provided by the Office of Risk Management.
18	(d) Report. On or before December 31, 2016, the Committee shall submit a
19	written report to the House Committees on Commerce and on Government
20	Operations and the Senate Committees on Finance and on Government
21	Operations with its findings, a recommendation as to whether the workers'

1	compensation adjustment and loss control functions of the Office of Risk
2	Management should be contracted out to a private entity, and any
3	recommendations for legislative, regulatory, or administrative action.
4	(e) Meetings.
5	(1) The Secretary of Administration shall call the first meeting of the
6	Committee to occur on or before July 15, 2016.
7	(2) The Committee shall select a chair from among its members at the
8	first meeting.
9	(4) The Committee shall cease to exist on January 1, 2017.
10	(f) Reimbursement.
11	(1) For attendance at meetings during adjournment of the General
12	Assembly, legislative members of the Committee shall be entitled to per diem
13	compensation and reimbursement of expenses pursuant to 2 V.S.A. § 406 for
14	no more than six meetings.
15	(2) Other members of the Committee who are not employees of the State
16	of Vermont and who are not otherwise compensated or reimbursed for their
17	attendance shall be entitled to reimbursement of expenses pursuant to
18	32 V.S.A. § 1010 for no more than six meetings.

1	Sec. 4b. OFFICE OF RISK MANAGEMENT; PRESERVATION OF
2	POSITIONS AND DUTIES
3	Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the positions and
4	duties assigned to the Office of Risk Management in the Agency of
5	Administration as of January 1, 2016 shall not be eliminated, reduced, or
6	transferred to another State agency, department, or entity, and the Agency of
7	Administration shall not enter into a privatization contract, as defined in
8	3 V.S.A. § 341, for the workers' compensation adjustment and loss control
9	functions of the Office of Risk Management until after January 1, 2017.
10	Second: In Sec. 5, Effective Date, by striking out Sec. 5 in its entirety and
11	inserting in lieu thereof a new Sec. 5 to read as follows:
12	Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATES
13	(a) This section and Sec. 4a shall take effect on passage.
14	(b) Notwithstanding 1 V.S.A. § 214(b), Sec. 4b shall take effect
15	retroactively on January 1, 2016.
16	(c) The remaining sections of this act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
