## CLINICAL EXPERIENCES

#### Vermont Technical College

#### **PROCEDURES**

There are 34 procedures listed in S. 20 under the proposed scope of practice for an LDP. Of these, 20 are current dental hygiene procedures, 6 are reversible procedures that could be added to current dental hygiene curriculum, and 9 are procedures that would be limited to the LDP scope of practice.

## CURRENT RDH PROCEDURES (20)

Oral health instruction and disease prevention education, including nutritional counseling and dietary analysis (VT)

Periodontal charting, including periodontal screening exam (VT)

**Exposing radiographs (VT)** 

**Dental prophylaxis (VT)** 

Applying topical preventive or prophylactic agents, including fluoride varnishes, antimicrobial agents, and pit and fissure sealants (VT)

Pulp vitality testing (VT)

Applying desensitizing medication or resin (VT)

Fabricating athletic mouthguards (VT)

Placement of temporary restorations (VT)

Fabricating soft occlusal guards (VT)

Interim therapeutic restorations (VT)

Changing periodontal dressings (VT)

Administering local anesthetic (VT)

Administering nitrous oxide (legal in many states. In VT, DH allowed to monitor but not administer)

Oral evaluation and assessment of dental disease (VT)

Formulating an individualized treatment plan (VT)

Placement of temporary crowns (VT)

Suture removal (VT)

**Brush biopsies (VT)** 

Mechanical polishing (VT)

All are under general supervision except for the administration of local anesthetics and monitoring nitrous oxide.

## POSSIBLE RDH PROCEDURES (6)

Reversible procedures not in dental hygiene scope of practice at this time, but could be added to DH curriculum as they are reversible procedures

Tissue conditioning and soft reline (R)

**Emergency palliative treatment of dental pain** 

Placement and removal of space maintainers

Restoring (filling) primary and permanent teeth, not including permanent tooth crowns, bridges, or denture fabrication

Preparation and placement of preformed crowns

Prescribing analgesics and antiinflammatories

### LDP PROCEDURES (9)

Irreversible procedures not in scope of practice for dental hygienist

**Tooth reimplantation** 

**Extractions of primary teeth** 

Non-surgical extractions of periodontally diseased permanent teeth

**Cavity preparation (drilling)** 

**Pulpotomies on primary teeth** 

Indirect and direct pulp capping on primary and permanent teeth

Repairing defective prosthetic devices

**Recementing permanent crowns** 

Prescribing, dispensing, and administering analgesics, antiinflammatories, and antibiotics

#### ACCREDITATION

Commission on Dental Accreditation has released Dental Therapy Standards; however, they do not plan to implement until:

- programs have been in operation for a sufficient period of time to establish benchmarks and adequately measure performance and
- Ther is evidence of need and support from the public and professional communities to sustain educational programs in the discipline

The Vermont Technical College program plans to fully comply with the accreditation standards when they are implemented.

The VTC Dental Hygiene program has maintained the accreditation status of approval without reporting requirements since it transitioned from UVM to VTC in 2004.
