

### Highway Safety: Reducing Highway Crashes & Fatalities



- 38% reduction in fatalities from 2013
- Lowest since WWII
  - 50% unbelted, 25% drug/alcohol,
    25% speed
- Vermont Highway Safety Alliance (established 2012)
  - Law enforcement, Emergency Responders
  - Educators: health, youth safety
  - Car dealers
  - Insurance companies (AAA)
  - Nonprofits (AARP, MPO)
  - State & Federal Partners (NHTSA, FHWA, AOE, AOT, DPS, DPH)






# Asset Performance Update

- Bridge Structural Deficiency:
  - In 2008 VT was 45<sup>th</sup> nationally for structurally deficient bridges
  - In 2013 VT improved to 28<sup>th</sup>
  - Percentage of structurally deficient highway bridges has declined from 16.1% in December 2008 to 7.1% in December 2014
- Pavement conditions:
  - 36 percent rated very poor in 2008
  - 13 percent rated very poor in 2014




## **Bridge Structural Deficiency**






#### **Pavement Conditions**
