Drusilla Roessle gave a powerpoint presentation on population<u>outcomes</u> and performance <u>accountability-measures</u> in the context of <u>Vermont's programs</u> <u>impacting</u>child poverty-programs.

o Housing and Homelessness

Erhard Mahnke testified-provided an overview of on housing and homelessness in Vermont-and the related programs. He outlined eurrent successes successful initiatives and ongoing State challenges future needs of these programs.

o Roadmap for Ending Homelessness Steering Committee

Angus Chaney identified <u>and described existing some of the programs</u> to support people <u>who in</u> need <u>of</u> housing that have been undertaken by the Agency of <u>Human Servicesin Vermont</u>. Jennifer Hollar gave an update on the work of the Roadmap for Ending Homelessness Steering Committee.

o Youth Homelessness

Mark Redmond described the services and programs of Spectrum Youth and Family Services. Bethany Pombar described the services of the Vermont Coalition of Runaway and Homeless Youth Programs along with <u>specific</u> funding concerns and other needs of homeless youth.

o Reach Up – Moving Families Out of Poverty

Erin Oalican described the services provided by Reach Up to meet the challenges facing participantsexperienced by low-income families. She also explained described the Post-Secondary Education program. A current and former Reach Up client each described their experience with the program. Eileen Nooney

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described the transportation <u>challenges</u> <u>challenges offacing</u> Vermonters in poverty. <u>Lori Wright, a former participant, and Jessa Denton, currently</u> <u>participating in the Post Secondary Education program, testified on their</u> <u>experience with the program.</u>

o Housing and Economic Supports

Richard Donahey described the expanded emergency housing programs of the Department for Children and Families, including a new partnership with the Office of Economic OpportunitiesGeneral Assistance Emergency Housing Program. Sarah Phillips described the trends in Vermont related to emergency shelter use and programs to provide this assistance for homeless Vermonters.

o Council Discussion and Next StepsRecommendations

• Convene Council subcommittees to draft recommendations related to each of the topics of testimony before the Council this year. Reps. Krowinski and Lanpher offered to compile this draft, if possible for the next Council meeting.

• Provide more funding for<u>resources to</u> the Post-Secondary Education program.

• Give preference, in the work of the Council, to areas that are currently not being emphasized by other groups/agencies. In particular, work on Focus the Council's work on transportation needs rather than child care or housing needs.and Reach Up

Raise Reach Up grants to meet the actual needs of families

Support the two generation approach in Reach Upp.

 Help people obtain the education required for higher level employment.

 De emphasize raising the minimum wage since it will not necessari solve the whole problem of poverty as a variety of services are needed.

Support Reach Up as a foundational program to reduce poverty-

Recognize that providing more affordable housing is basic to reducing poverty.

• Follow the Spectrum model for service to homeless youth in other parts of Vermont.
