Brain Science: early years matter

- Washington state used brain science to improve and expand their early learning system of care
- ACES study: childhood trauma/stress affects adult well-being and health
- Evidence-based programs: rigorously evaluating programs and testing for results
 - New Mexico using results to make decisions about programs and funding
 - Home visiting programs and federal funding mandates
