10	Statement of purpose of bill as introduced: This bill proposes to combine,
11	eliminate, and provide per diems for certain State boards and commission; to
12	provide for a review of the ongoing necessity for the State's boards and
13	commissions; to amend the membership of the Health Reform Oversight
14	Committee; and to amend provisions relating to the Labor Board Review
15	Panel.

16 An act relating to boards and commissions

1	It is hereby enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont:
2	* * * Merger of Groundwater and Well Water Committees * * *
3	Sec. 1. 10 V.S.A. § 1392 is amended to read:
4	§ 1392. DUTIES; POWERS OF SECRETARY
5	(a) The Secretary shall develop a comprehensive groundwater management
6	program to protect the quality of groundwater resources by:
7	* * *
8	(c)(1) The Secretary shall establish a groundwater coordinating committee,
9	with representation from the Division of Drinking Water and Groundwater
10	Protection within the Department, the Division of Geology and Mineral
11	Resources within the Department, the Agency of Agriculture, Food and
12	Markets, and the Departments of Forests, Parks and Recreation and of Health
13	to provide advice in the development of the program and its implementation,
14	on issues concerning groundwater quality and quantity, and on groundwater
15	issues relevant to well-drilling activities and the licensure of well drillers.
16	(2) In carrying out his or her duties under this subchapter, the Secretary
17	shall give due consideration to the recommendations of the groundwater
18	coordinating committee.

1	(3) The Secretary may request representatives of other agencies and the
2	private sector, including licensed well drillers, to serve on the groundwater
3	coordinating committee.

6	§ 1395b. WATER WELL ADVISORY COMMITTEE
7	(a) The Vermont water well advisory committee is created. The committee
8	shall consist of seven members: the director of the groundwater and water
9	supply division, the state geologist, a representative from the department of
10	health, and four members appointed by the governor. Three of the four public
11	members shall be licensed well drillers, with at least five years of experience.
12	The fourth public member shall be a person not associated with the well-
13	drilling business who has an interest in wells and water quality.
14	(b) The purpose of the committee is to advise and assist agency personnel
15	in the formulation of policy, including recommended statutory and regulatory
16	changes, regarding the proper installation and maintenance of water wells,
17	licensing of well drillers, and groundwater issues impacted by well-drilling
18	activities. The committee shall promote and encourage cooperation and
19	communication between governmental agencies, licensed well drillers, and
20	members of the general public.

1	(c) Members shall be appointed for terms of five years, with the initial
2	appointments of the public members made for lesser terms, so that the
3	appointments do not all expire simultaneously. Vacancies shall be filled by the
4	governor for the length of an unexpired term.
5	(d) The committee shall elect a chair and a secretary, and shall meet from
6	time to time as may be necessary, but not less than quarterly.
7	(e) The public members of the committee shall be volunteers, and will
8	serve without compensation. [Repealed.]
9	Sec. 3. IMPLEMENTATION
10	(a) The terms of the members of the Vermont Water Well Advisory
11	Committee shall expire on the effective date of this act.
12	(b) The Secretary of Natural Resources may provide those members with
13	the opportunity to serve on the groundwater coordinating committee.

17	(a) There is established a Valuation Appeal Board to consist of five
18	members. The members shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice
19	and consent of the Senate, for three-year terms beginning February 1 of the
20	year in which the appointment is made, except that one of the initial
21	appointments shall be for a term of one year and two of the initial

1	appointments shall be for a term of two years. A vacancy in the Board shall be
2	filled in the same manner as the original appointment for the unexpired portion
3	of the term vacated.
4	(b) Persons serving on the Appeal Board shall be knowledgeable and
5	experienced in at least one of the following fields: agriculture, business

15	(a) Creation.
16	(1) There is created the Sunset Advisory Commission to review existing
17	State boards and commissions, to recommend the elimination of any board or
18	commission that it deems no longer necessary or the revision of any of the
19	powers and duties of a board or commission, and to recommend whether
20	members of the boards and commissions should be entitled to receive per diem
21	compensation.

1	(2) As used in this section, "State boards and commissions" means
2	professional or occupational licensing boards or commissions, advisory boards
3	or commissions, appeals boards, promotional boards, interstate boards,
4	supervisory boards and councils, and any other boards or commissions of the
5	State.
6	(b) Membership.
7	(1) The Commission shall be composed of the following six members:
8	(A) two current members of the House of Representatives who shall
9	not both be from the same political party and one of whom shall be appointed
10	co-chair, who shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House;
11	(B) two current members of the Senate, who shall not both be from
12	the same political party and one of whom shall be appointed co-chair, who
13	shall be appointed by the Committee on Committees; and
14	(C) two persons appointed by the Governor.
15	(2) Members shall be appointed at the beginning of each biennium. A
16	member shall serve biennially and until his or her successor is appointed,
17	except that a legislative member's term on the Commission shall expire on the
18	date he or she ceases to be a member of the General Assembly.
19	(c) Powers and duties. The Commission shall have the following powers
20	and duties:
21	(1) Inventory; group; review schedule.

1	(A)(i) The Commission shall inventory all of the State boards and
2	commissions, organize them into groups, and establish a schedule to conduct a
3	review of one group each biennium.
4	(ii) The inventory shall include the names of the members of the
5	State boards and commissions, their term length and expiration, and their
6	appointing authority.
7	(B) The Commission shall provide its inventory of the State boards
8	and commissions to the Secretary of State for the Secretary to maintain as set
9	forth in section 116a of this title.
10	(2) Biennial review.
11	(A) Each biennium, the Commission shall review all of the State
12	boards and commissions within one of its inventoried groups and shall take
13	testimony regarding whether each of those boards and commissions should
14	continue to operate or be eliminated and whether the powers and duties of any
15	of those boards and commissions should be revised.
16	(B) In its review of each State board and commission, the
17	Commission shall consider:
18	(i) the purpose of the board or commission and whether that
19	purpose is still needed;
20	(ii) how well the board or commission performs in executing that
21	purpose; and

1	(iii) if the purpose is still needed, whether State government would
2	be more effective and efficient if the purpose were executed in a different
3	manner.
4	(C) Each board and commission shall have the burden of justifying
5	its continued operation.
6	(D) For any board or commission that the Commission determines
7	should continue to operate, the Commission shall also determine whether
8	members of that board or commission should be entitled to receive per diem
9	compensation and if so, the amount of that compensation.
10	(3) Biennial report. On or before the end of the biennium during which
11	it reviews a group, the Commission shall submit to the House and Senate
12	Committees on Government Operations its findings, any recommendation to
13	eliminate a State board or commission within that group or to revise the powers
14	and duties of a board or commission within the group, its recommendations
15	regarding board or commission member per diem compensation, and any other
16	recommendations for legislative action. The Commission shall also
17	specifically recommend whether there should be changes to the information the
18	Secretary of State provides in his or her inventory of the State boards and
19	commissions as set forth in 3 V.S.A. § 116a. The provisions of 2 V.S.A.
20	§ 20(d) (expiration of required reports) shall not apply to the report to be made
21	under this subsection.

1	(d) Assistance. The Commission shall have the administrative, technical,
2	and legal assistance of the Office of Legislative Council, the Joint Fiscal
3	Office, and the Agency of Administration.
4	(e) Compensation and expense reimbursement.
5	(1) For attendance at meetings during adjournment of the General
6	Assembly, a legislative member of the Commission shall be entitled to per
7	diem compensation and reimbursement of expenses pursuant to 2 V.S.A. § 406
8	for not more than five meetings per year. These payments shall be made from
9	monies appropriated to the General Assembly.
10	(2) Other members of the Commission shall be entitled to per diem
11	compensation and reimbursement of expenses as permitted under
12	32 V.S.A. § 1010 for not more than five meetings per year. These payments
13	shall be made from monies appropriated to the Agency of Administration.

15	§ 921. CREATION; MEMBERSHIP, COMPENSATION
16	(a) There is hereby created a State Labor Relations Board composed of six
17	members. The Governor shall appoint the members with the advice and
18	consent of the Senate for a term of six years or for the member's unexpired
19	term from a list of nominees presented by the Labor Board Review Panel. The
20	appointments shall be made within 60 days of an expired term or vacancy.

1	(1) The Labor Board Review Panel shall be composed of five members
2	to include the executive director of the Vermont Bar Association, the
3	Commissioner of Labor, the State Court Administrator, and a Representative
4	representative of Labor labor and a Representative representative of
5	employers, both of whom shall be appointed for two-year terms by the
6	Commissioner of Labor from names provided by labor organizations and
7	employers in the State. The Commissioner shall request names of potential
8	representatives of labor and employers from at least three Vermont labor
9	organizations and three Vermont employer organizations, respectively.
10	(2) The Labor Board Review Panel shall:
11	(A) At least 90 days prior to the expiration of a term or as soon as a
12	vacancy is announced or created, the Review Panel shall request from both
13	Vermont labor organizations and Vermont employer organizations, over which
14	the Board has jurisdiction for dispute adjudication, and from organizations that
15	train or employ persons to serve in a neutral role in labor management relations
16	a list of nominees for each position is to be filled. The Review Panel shall
17	issue public notices of vacancies on the Board. An individual may apply for
18	consideration as a nominee for a vacant board Board position.
19	(B)(i) Consider the experience, knowledge, character, integrity,
20	judgment, and ability to act in a fair and impartial manner of each nominee in
21	compiling a list of nominees for board Board membership. The Review Panel

shall consider the skills, perspectives, and experience of the nominees and
ensure a continuing balance on the Board of labor, management, and neutral
backgrounds in determining those nominees qualified to be forwarded to the
Governor under subsection (c) of this section.
(ii) For each individual that the Panel is considering forwarding to
the Governor under subsection (c) of this section, the Panel shall interview the
individual and contact at least one individual who can serve as a reference for
the individual under consideration.
(iii) "Nominees with neutral backgrounds" means individuals in
high standing not connected with any labor organization or management
position, and who can be reasonably considered to be able to serve as an
impartial individual.
(2)(3) To be eligible for appointment to the Board an individual shall be
a citizen of the United States and resident of the State of Vermont for one year
immediately preceding appointment. A member of the Board may not hold
any other State office.
(3)(4) Each case that comes before the Board for a hearing shall be
heard and decided by a panel of three or five members appointed by the Board
Chair. Two members of a three-member panel and three members of a five-
member panel shall constitute a quorum with authority to conduct a hearing,
provided that all members of the Panel shall review the record and participate

1	in the Panel's decision. The Board may review a proposed decision by a Panel
2	prior to its issuance for the sole purpose of insuring that questions of law are
3	being decided in a consistent manner.

7	This act shall take effect on July 1, 2018, except that Sec. 12, 3 V.S.A.
8	§ 116a (Secretary of State; maintenance of inventory of State boards and
