# STATE OF VERMONT SPECIAL SESSION, 2018

## Wednesday, May 23, 2018

In accordance with the call for a Special Session by His Excellency, the Governor, the members of the House of Representatives convened at the State House in Montpelier on the twenty-third day of May, 2018.

At ten o'clock in the forenoon, the Honorable Mitzi Johnson of South Hero, Speaker, called the House to order. Devotional exercises were conducted by Rep. Anne Donahue of Northfield.

## **Governor's Call for Special Session**

"I, Philip B. Scott, Governor of the State of Vermont, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution, find it necessary to call together the Vermont General Assembly, and I do hereby summon the members of the Senate and House of Representatives to meet in their respective chambers in the State House, together with the officers of the two Houses, on Wednesday, the 23rd day of May, A.D., 2018, at 10:00 in the forenoon, for the purposes of providing Vermonters property tax relief through level statewide property tax rates, stabilizing the State's system of education finance and make appropriations for State government for fiscal year 2019.

Upon adjournment sine die of the Special Session all such matters contained in these new bills and resolutions not passed by the General Assembly shall terminate automatically.
